PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

BUREAUCRATS, SERVANTS OR DICTATORS?
There is an increasing danger that in our democracy we exercise the greatest right it gives us just once in three or four years as the case may be—the casting of a vote at election time—and then sit back and forget all that goes on in the interim. Now and again we raise our eyebrows at the actions of certain Ministers and their officials, and we are perturbed in a passive sort of way when we read in the papers about increases in the rate-payers burdens.

Bureaucracy, set up to make for efficiency and to make the "corruption" out of public life and of course originally to carry out the wishes of the elected representatives of the people, has developed into a monster. Of course, most of it is not of blame for this development must rest on our own shoulders. At times for convenience sake, short cuts to democratic responsibilities have caused precedents which later became the rule and which saw more and more power being handed over to officials. Bureaucratic sport cuts which have justified the public in some cases can become dangerous weapons at future dates when operated by different minded personnel to those who were responsible for introducing them.

I thought of this when I saw a report of last week's quarterly meeting of Waterford County Council where an Arbitration Scheme was agreed to the future wage claims of officials was approved by the Council.

To my mind this was a very serious matter but for a multitude of reasons at the time the decision was made less than a year ago the membership of the Council—ten out of twenty-three—were present.

Arbitration and Conciliation schemes are admirable in many ways but I doubt if such an objective can be applied to the scheme adopted by the County Council. It was a serious matter which argued the Council to accept it that it would ease the position where the negotiations regarding wage claims were concerned and that it was merely a matter of simplifying a position which was at present being dealt with in a haphazard and unsatisfactory manner. There was no financial commitment on the part of the Council which had to be worried with the result.

I'm very interested. I'm sure the only person who apparently was wide awake to the issues involved was the Chairman, Mr. Charlie Curran, who remarked that while no immediate financial commitment was involved on the part of the Council, it was a matter of principle to accept the results of the arbitration.

However, only four of the ten thought it to head the Chairman's warning—six members voted for the scheme—six out of twenty-three. And that was sufficient to pass it. Now let us look at the Arbitration Scheme which has been passed. Rule 2 of Part I states that the purpose of the scheme is to provide means acceptable to the County and City Managers' Association and the various trade associations for dealing with claims relating to remuneration of Council officials.
