County Agricultural Estimates Up

Members Criticise Expenditure On Poultry Instruction

Provisional allocations totalling 223,836 for the various schemes and services under their control for the year 1964/65 were approved by the County Waterford Committee of Agriculture at the Annual Schemes Meeting of the Committee held in Dungarvan on Saturday last. The total is an increase of 21,703 on the current year's estimate of 202,133 and represents a demand of 10d. in the £ on the rates as compared with 8d. this year.

Mr. L. Dempsey, Inspector, Department of Agriculture, who with Mr. George G.A.O. looked at the estimates, pointed out that the major increase in the overall total was caused by the increase of 41,815 (from 22,000 to 63,815) for Agricultural Instruction. The reason for this increase he told the members was that the Committee had now moved into the full time of the year for Agricultural Instruction. Last year's estimate, he said, only provided for the 1964/65 year and was intended to be made to pay the extra.

Mr. G. Heskin thought that any money spent on instruction of this kind was money well spent, but he was not going to oppose it. Mr. W. 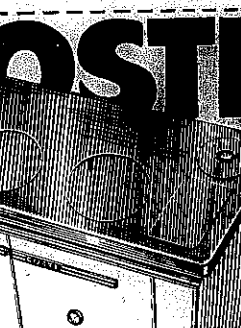
