## PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

**THE LAST OF CHRISTMAS**  
 On the first day of Christmas my true love sent to me—  
 One of the well-known Christmas songs which recalls the full span of the yuletide festivities which range over twelve days. The great festival commences at midnight on Christmas night when we recall the birth of the Divine Redeemer and goes on through the passing of the old year and the birth of the new up to its close on "Little Christmas" day on January 6. This has also been called "Women's Christmas" or "hungry Christmas" because by the time it is reached most of the cupboard is filled in preparation for Christmas. It has been called "The Last of Christmas" because of the course of the Christmas parties, the Epiphany and this word is something of a mystery to most people. Actually the meaning of the strange word is simply "to show" and the occasion is so called because it was on that day that Christ revealed himself to the three kings from the East and so for the first time to the gentiles which the kings represented as apart from the Jewish world into which He was born.

Up to recent times January 6, the Feast of the Circumcision or New Year's Day and the Epiphany have both always been Church holidays, but last year the Epiphany was deleted from the list of such holidays. However, it has been "switched" around this year and once again it is a public holiday. It has been restored as a Church holiday while January 1 has been struck off the list. It has always remained the twelfth day, the last of Christmas and continues to mark the taking down of the house decorations, the relegation of the Christmas tree from its place of honour, and the quenching of the multi-coloured fairy lights for another year's sake. Indeed, especially for the younger ones . . . . .

### HEALTH BOARD APPROVES SALARY INCREASES

**More Money For Boilermen And Labourers**

Six of the sixteen items on the agenda for the adjourned monthly meeting of the Waterford Health Authority held in Dungarvan on Monday, were concerned with wage increases, and all but one were approved. The position was particularly concerned with the Boilermen and Labourers. In regard to an application from the Compounder of Medicines in Dungarvan for revised rates of pay, the members were informed by Mr. S. Gianville, Staff Officer, that this application had been made to the Board in October 1902, but had then been referred to the Board at its meeting on the 12th of the same month. The new scale requested was 14/- an hour for the first six hours, 10/- an hour for the next six hours, and 4/- an hour for hours worked in excess of 12. Mr. Gianville also pointed out that the increase had been granted to the other two compounders employed by the Board at the time when they appealed to the Minister, but the man in Dungarvan had not been granted the same. It was stated that the payment of the new rates would require an excess expenditure of £387.

**More For Boilermen**—In the case of an application for increased rates for boilermen employed by the Authority, it was stated by Mr. S. Gianville that the last round of increases was granted in 1901. The new scale requested was 14/- an hour for the first six hours, 10/- an hour for the next six, and 8/- an hour for the rest. 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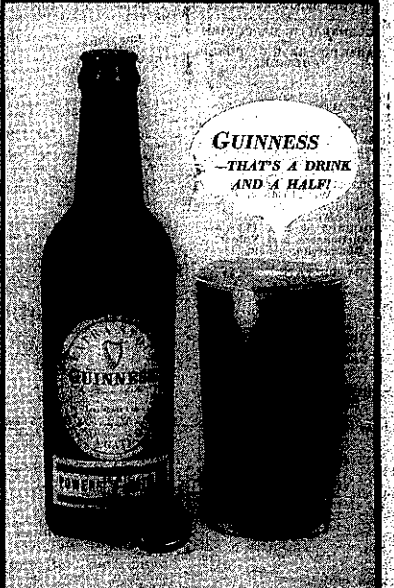
