THE J.F.K. MEMORIAL PARK
Easter Sunday will be a big occasion for the people of the beautiful united Parishes of Knockmore, Kiltwatermy and Gleadne, and provided the day is fine, of course, everyone will be praying for there should be a big influx of visitors to this most scenic district. The lower part of the park is the Irish Rhine.

For some considerable time now a band of voluntary workers their new Parochial Park and grounds will be ready to receive the people of the parishes with an opportunity of paying tribute to the late President of the United States, John Fitzgerald Kennedy, for that is to be the official name of the Park and the blessing and opening ceremony will be performed on Easter Sunday.

The field was purchased from the Land Commission last year by the local Clergy and is to become parochial property. Following the assassination of President Kennedy the parishes were happily induced to name it in commemoration of the great man and situated as it is, adjacent to the junction of the Knockmore and Kiltwatermy roads, it is a well-rewarded yard of the village. This five-acre piece will indeed prove a worthy memorial to the man who meant as much, if not more, to us Irish as to his own Americans.

The people of the United Parishes must indeed be pleased to see such an ambitious undertaking so near fruition and great credit is due to the reverend Fr. Priest, the Rev. Fr. Power and to the Committee and workers in charge of Rev. Fr. O'Connell, Fr. Deane, Fr. Montayne, M.C.C.

I am glad to be able to record that there is a strong local organisation, spear-headed by the Sparracoe Hurling Club, in the locality and all are now working hard to have the pitch in apple order for the great opening on Easter Sunday.

A very attractive programme has been arranged with a great variety of amusements, including the Blackrock (Cork) and Bally's Own (Waterford) while the local Shamrocks team will cross campans with Four-milewater. BETTER LIVING STANDARDS FOR FARMERS
