TREATMENT AND CARE OF MENTALLY HANDICAPPED CHILDREN
The very important problem of the treatment and care of mentally handicapped children in this country was touched on by members of the Waterford Health Authority at their meeting in Dungarvan. This was the first of a series of meetings on this subject, which will be held in the near future. The first meeting was held in the "Idea" Home Exhibition in Dublin.

In 1922 there was only one institution in Ireland which cared for handicapped children and this could only accommodate 130 cases. Since then, however, the number of institutions has grown to 18 and in the near future plans for about 2,300 will be available.

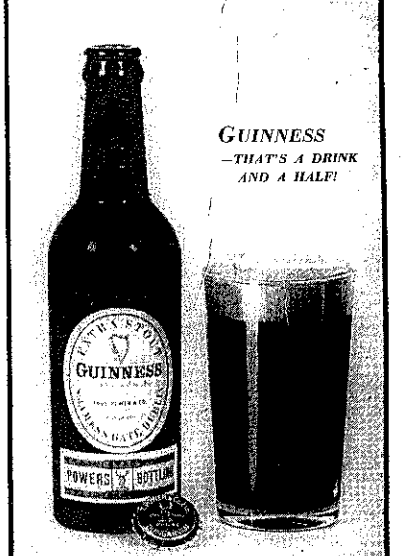
KILMEADEN CHEESE FACTORY
Proposition To Health Authority
Correspondence was read from the Dungarvan Co-Operative Creamery at last Monday's meeting of the County Health Authority in Dungarvan, concerning the proposed erection of a cheese factory at Kilmeaden, near the town of Dungarvan. COURT'S VIEW IN DUNGARVAN DAY DISPUTE
Having investigated a dispute between the Amalgamated Transport and General Workers' Union and Messrs. John Plehan and Co., Thomas Power and Co. Ltd., and A. Moloney and Sons, Ltd., Dungarvan, concerning differential rates for lorry drivers, increased rates for shift workers, commission rates for salesmen and retrospective pay, the Labour Court has issued its recommendations.
The Court states that it is satisfied that in the case of the lorry drivers special circumstances exist and recommends that the differential should be increased to 2/6.
It does not recommend any variation in the shift differential and states that having regard to the practice in Dungarvan of establishing as a town rate the differential between the town and the country, it recommends that the increase in the basic rate and in the lorry driver differential should operate for January 3 last.
