## PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

### THE IRISH REVIVAL CAMPAIGN

A campaign to enlist popular support for the Irish language revival movement organised by the Gaelic League, started last month will reach its climax during the present month when local committees will approach everyone to sign a national declaration of goodwill for the language.

This declaration will take the form of a request to the Government to have incorporated in the forthcoming White Paper on the Irish Language Commission's Report, a comprehensive and progressive plan designed to accelerate the restoration of the Irish language among all sections of the community.

The Committee sponsoring the move is composed of the heads of the following language bodies: Comra na Gaeilge, Curann na Sagar, Comhaltas Naistanta na Gaeilge, Gael Linn, Ghan na Bua and An Comhairle.

Already local organisers working on a parish basis have got public bodies and local social and sporting organisations to adopt resolutions asking the Taoiseach and the Government to formulate a positive policy in conformity with the findings of the Language Commission's Report. Now I am afraid that most of the resolutions were passed with little or no regard to what was implied in them. In the majority of cases no discussions took place and very few even knew that the Commission's report made no less than 28 recommendations. What then is the real value of these resolutions and what percentage of them will be put into effect?

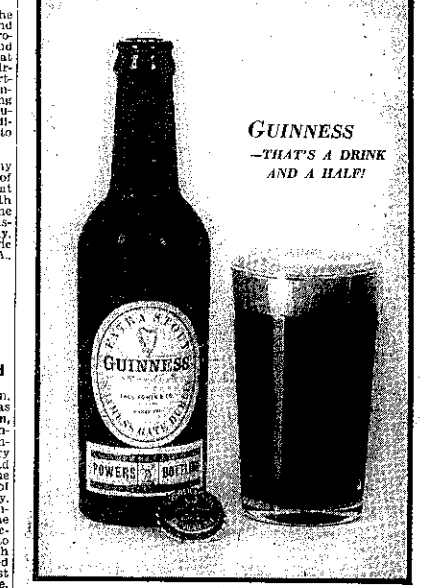
## HOUSING POSITION IN COUNTY "FAR FROM SATISFACTORY"
