Reporting another very successful season, Mr. Seamus O'Brien, Secretary, states in his report that despite the many and varied problems which arose because of a very crowded championship and league programme, we were able to complete all our competitions almost on schedule.

The number of affiliations was the same as last year, but the number of teams entered showed an increase of thirteen. Seventy-two clubs entered a new record total of one hundred and seven teams, and all but eight of these played in the championships.
