Behind the Spotlight

YOU AND THE MENTALLY
HANDICAPPED CHILD

What are your reactions to
children who are mentally
handicapped? What do you
think about the fact that
another far children they had
conscious that a problem exists
and have you ideas about it?
If your attitude can't be
more positive, then your
care less.

There are questions which
need to be faced now or in the
near future and answered by
every member of the community
who is conscious of his respon-
sibilities. It is a matter
of every individual himself to
decide on the issues.

Mental handicap may be a
new term but the problem it
refers to is not new. But what
is indeed new is the approach
which can now be taken to it.
A welcome change to the old
shameful attitude which typified
so many of the problems which
we did not understand.

Silences, attached to popular
and sentimentalism in the
same way as it did to mental
handicap. The family with a
mentally disabled child hid him
in the act of backroom
negotiations about him. There
he was left for years until
death finally claimed him—a
bit on the scuttled of his bed
and a few coins in his pocket.
The treatment was "should have
been on the social conscience".

In recent years we have faced
up to it in such a frank and
open way that the people are at
last beginning to really face up
to their responsibility where
the handicapped child is concerned.

No longer can it merely be the
problem of the immediate
family concerned—it is
now recognised as a general
social problem which must be
tackled with all the resources at
the command of the community.

People in these districts are
thinking becoming more con-
scious of this since the Mercy
Nuns in Cappoquin took the
first move to re-adapt St
Micheal's Orphanage as a resi-
dential day school for the
mentally handicapped children.

A group of full-time students,
mainly from the School of
Librarianship at the North
Western Polytechnic, London,
South Tipperary and Cork
in connection with the tour
of Ireland, have sent
and plans are being made to
make the public informed of the
extent of the problem and what
is being done to meet it.

The local committee in Dungarvan
is a most representative
and energetic one. It has met
already on a number of occasions
but the main point of the
tour will be a Lecture and Film
Show at the local Courthouse
next Monday night where Waterford
woman having been born in Dungarvan
she learned the subject from the new

As this is a problem which
affects everyone, I think all who
can should make a point of
attending the Lecture and Film
show and of co-operating in
whatever way is possible for
them afterwards. The work is
a vital effort from which great
satisfaction can be derived not
to mention the supernatural
benefits promised by the
Saviour when He said: "What
ever you do for these my least
brethren you do for Me."
