PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

YOU AND THE MENTALLY HANDICAPPED CHILD

What are your reactions to children who are mentally handicapped? Are you conscious that a problem exists and have you tried to do anything about it? Is your attitude one of courtesy or indifference?

These are questions which must be faced now or in the near future and answered by every member of the community who is conscious of his responsibility and it is a matter for each individual himself to decide on the answer.

Mental handicap may be a new term but the problem it refers to is not new. But what is indeed new is the approach which is now being made to it. A welcome change to the old, shameful attitude which typified so many of the problems which we did not understand.

Stigmata attached to mental illness and tuberculosis in the same way as it did to mental handicap. The family with a mentally defective child hid him in the attic or a backroom and never spoke about it. There he was left for years until death finally claimed him. A blot on the escutcheon of the family. But what a blot such a child was on the social consciousness of the community.

It was years before we faced up to such a child and took to God. I believe that the country and the people are only fast beginning to really live up to their responsibility to the handicapped child. It is no longer can it be merely the province of the medical family concerned—it is now recognised as a general social problem which is tackled with all the resources at the command of the community.

People in these districts are I think becoming more conscious of this since the Mercy Nuns in Cappoquin took the first move to re-adapt St. Michael's Orphanage as a residential day school for the rare and education of mildly mentally handicapped children. A special committee have been set up all over West Waterford, South Tipperary and East Cork in connection with the school. The extent of the problem and what is being done to overcome it. The local organizer in Dungarvan is a most representative man. He has met already on a number of occasions but his first public venture was a Lecture and Film Show at the local Cinema on next Monday night when he will bring before you all the information dealing with the subject which will be available.

As this is a problem which, as I have already pointed out, affects everyone and of which everyone, I think that all who should make a point of attending the lecture and film show and fully co-operating in whatever way is possible for the satisfaction can be derived only by mention the supernatural benefits promised by the Saviour when He said "Whatsoever you do to these my least brethren you do to Me."
