Jury Calls For Further Medical Testimony
The inquest on Edward Loneran (51) married farmer and agricultural contractor of Lackaniska, Ballinacorney and widow of Garrydoyle, Co. Limerick, whose charred body was found in a burnt out car at Garrydoyle, Dungarvan, in the early hours of Tuesday morning, April 13, was adjourned in Dungarvan on Tuesday evening last following a difference of opinion between Mr. E. P. King, Solicitor, representing the next of kin of Mr. Loneran, and Mr. A. V. Maher, Solicitor, representing the insurers of the ill-fated vehicle.

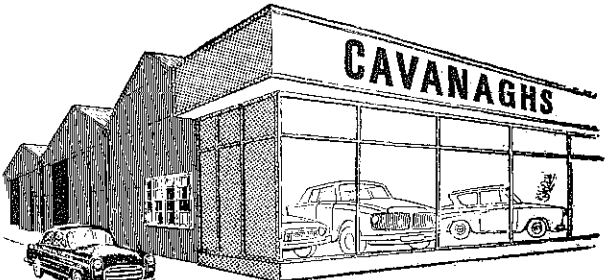
