## WATERFORD SNATCH LATE VICTORY

### Midfield Problems Solved — Attack Poses New Ones

**Waterford 3-8; Limerick 2-9**

It looked as if the Cork Athletic Grounds would be Waterford's home for the hurling honour in the 1965 All-Ireland championship on Sunday last, when they trailed a dominant Limerick side by 10 points with only three minutes left for play. The Shannonsiders looked safely through to the semi-final against Cork. Limerick, however, with a 21 yards free, sharpshooter Philly Grimes, was blocked in the Limerick goal mouth and, lightning-like, Frank Walsh, his partner, sent the ball crashing to the back of the net to put Waterford on terms. This score seemed to end the deadlock for Limerick, as Waterford started back with a point. However, the Shannonsiders, Chemey and Jimmy Byrne, snatched victory in the dying seconds of the game.

### TURNED DEFEAT INTO VICTORY

It was Walsh's goal coming at such a crucial period of the game which turned almost certain defeat into a great victory as the greater skill and craft of the winners gave them the advantage over the Shannonsiders who cracked under the furious do-or-die Waterford onslaught in the tense-packed final minutes of the game.

### MASTERFUL DISPLAY

It was a lucky day for Waterford, for, had it not been for the lead 2-2 to 1-4, the interval having played against the wind in the first half, it had taken the 10 minutes to overcome the Limerick defence which had held its record. It was before Waterford raised a single flag that they had taken most of the honours in this half and especially when the Shannonsiders, after a long spell of attack, had driven the Limerick forwards to some thing which is also difficult to explain. As a matter of fact, some of Limerick's goals came from the counter-attack, as did the last one, scored by the Seamer.

Apart from Grimes, Limerick had good attackers in Grace and Twomey, while Pat Doherty, Jim O'Dwyer and Dan Donegan also played well.

With Norris, Timmy Healy also had a good game in defence at centrefield and attack while Paddy Walsh at midfield was outstanding.
