A requiem service of ours will sing the praises of Frank Ryan both as a singer and a soldier of Ireland in the cause of freedom. Frank Ryan was fighting for us very gallantly. It is indeed sad to think that the voice which was hailed as a second John McCormack is forever stilled in death. Funeral casket on the shoulders of Frank Ryan and he remained the same humble and lovable personality with a smile on his lips.
