A WORTHY COLLECTION
Parishioners in Dungarvan should note the fact that the Parish Clerk has done a very creditable job in collecting for the Masses at all Masses in Dungarvan on next Sunday. The collection was made only at the Masses at the Parish Church, but for the first time the collection will also be made at Masses at the Priory Church this year.
There is no need for me to tell the people of Dungarvan about the work which the Parish Clerk has done. He is so early every morning to open the church for the first Mass and is there late in the evening throughout the day he has a multitude of tasks, ringing the bells, answering queries at the sacristy and the hundred and one other things that have to be done.
And for the Clerk there is no five-day week either the work goes on over the full seven days with more to be done if anything on Sundays. Remember then when you go to Mass next Sunday to prepare a collection a little more than you did last year. Remember that this collection is the main source of income for the year, and remember also that the cost of the Masses has gone up in the same way for this year as it has gone up for last year.

BLOOD DONORS
The Cork Blood Transfusion Service will hold their second session in Dungarvan at the Town Hall from 8 p.m. to 9 p.m. tonight (Thursday).
The first session was held on August 12th and it was reported that more than forty civic-spirited donors turned up. Not a great number you will agree from a town the size of Dungarvan.
Becoming a blood donor and donating a pint of blood is a very simple matter. It is recognized as one of the greatest charities in modern times. There is a constant call from the hospitals for blood to be given in cases of accident, surgery, operations, confinements, and for this reason the need for ever more and more donors is increasing.
Over the years I have noted that it is practically the same people who turn up to these blood donor sessions. It is sad to see new young faces. Surely the young men and women of Dungarvan have not become so selfish or turned so callous that they cannot spare the time or face the slight inconvenience necessary to donate a pint of blood. Many people with no experience of what it involves think that the operation is very painful and dangerous. It is neither one nor the other. There is absolutely no pain involved, and if anything donating a pint of blood can have good rather than bad effects. I know friends of mine who have donated ten or twelve pints of blood down through the years. They have suffered no ill-effects, and I am told that it gives them a very satisfying feeling to know that the blood which they have donated has saved more than one life. Now what about you?

THE MEANS TEST
I understand that there was quite a lot of talk and a deal of adverse comment following the publication last week of the results of the County Council scholarship examination.
Many people felt that several names on the list should not have been there, but it would seem that most of those who do not understand the terms of the Council's scheme. The sum of £2,000 was allocated by the Council this year for scholarships in Secondary, Vocational and other Approved Schools, and of this amount not more than £500 was allocated with regard to whether the parents or guardians of the children complied with the income and valuation limits incorporated in the scheme. In other words without regard as to whether they complied or not with the means test.

The value of the scholarships is £1,200 a year for 5 years if a student's home is under £200, from the second school year £250 a year if it is over £200 but less than £300, and if it is more than £300 in the middle of the twenty-seven County Councils.

OVER £27,000 OVEREXPENDITURE IN H.A. ACCOUNTS APPROVED

£11,000 To Cover Salary Increases To Dispensary Doctors

When the Abstract of Accounts for the year ending March 31, 1955, came before the Board of Health at its monthly meeting on August 15, the expenditure of the Waterford Health Authority in Dungarvan, approved by the Secretary, Mr. J. Hynes, was £27,378 in excess of that allowed in the estimates. When Mr. Lannen asked for details, he was informed by the Secretary that the total was made up of £14,000 for General Medical Services, £3,188 for 72 and other infectious diseases, £1,212 for Ambulance Service, £3,600 for Mental Health Service, and £2,368 for Public Assistance.

INCREASED GRANTS FOR D.N. ASSOCIATIONS
Because District Nursing Associations must pay 100 per cent of the salaries of the Health Authority (£200 x 220 to £1,100 per annum) the Department were prepared to sanction increased grants by the Health Authority to the District Nursing Association in Dungarvan. This was stated in a letter read at last Monday's meeting of the Waterford Health Authority in Dungarvan. The increased grants total £240 and the Secretary Mr. J. Hynes, said that the total required to provide these to the various Associations in the county was £3,350.

THE CHAIRMAN, MR. P. BROWNE, Mayor said that these Associations were doing great work and relieving the Health Authority of a lot of responsibility. Proposing that the grants be approved, Mr. J. Griffin said that they could not spend money in a better way from a human point of view at any rate.

MR. W. KENNEDY, T.D. seconded the proposal which was carried by 10 votes to 2.

BIG WAITING LIST
During a discussion on a proposal to increase the capitation rates for certain institutions for Mental Defectives (from £7-10 to £9-10 a week in some cases and from £6-6 to £7-7 in other cases) it was stated that the total annual additional cost would be £1,400. The Secretary stated that the cost of children in the county was at present £13,000 per annum.

MR. T. GALLAGHER said that they had a waiting list of between 10 and 15 children whose parents were seeking to have them placed.

MR. LANNEN asked about the proposal to open a school in Cappoquin. He was informed that this project had been turned down by the Department. Mr. Lannen said that he would take in 50 or 60 children. I think our P.D.'s should take up this with the Minister.

MR. KENNEDY said that this was just a matter of appointing a charge hand and he felt they should be able to fill it from the existing staff at Ardkeen.

Following some further discussion it was agreed to leave the matter to the Acting Manager. The salary was fixed at £600 and a recommendation was made that the post should be filled from the existing staff.

CAR ACCIDENT INQUEST ADJOURNED

Criminal Proceedings Being Contemplated

An inquest into the circumstances surrounding the death of Patrick Fitzgerald, 37, single, unmarried labourer, 14 Congress Villas, Dungarvan, in a road accident which occurred near Garrynagh Cross, Clonca, Dungarvan, on Thursday evening, July 29, was opened by Dr. D. Healy, Coroner, sitting with a jury at the Court-house, Dungarvan, on last Friday evening and adjourned at the request of Supl. M. English who stated that criminal proceedings were being contemplated.

The jury was Messrs. Nicholas O'Keefe, Michael O'Keefe, James Meade, William Feeney, James Meade, Andrew O'Donnell, Thomas Dolan and James Delaney.

MR. SEAN BRENAN, B.L. (sitting with J. Keane & Sons, Dublin, drivers of the car involved in the accident, and Mr. E. P. King, Solicitor, J. F. Williams & Co.) represented the defendants.

IDENTIFICATION

She stated that she saw a body at the morgue at the District Hospital on Friday, July 30, which she identified as that of her brother Patrick Fitzgerald.
