GOOD NEWS FOR HOUSE SEEKERS

There was good news for those in the 2600 to 4100 a year income group seeking houses in Dungarvan and district at the last meeting of the local Urban Council when preliminary details of plans for a scheme of fully serviced sites on which a number of houses are to be erected were outlined.

The Town Clerk explained to the members of the Council that it was intended to apply to the National Building Agency to build the houses but that they would only be interested if the demand was adequate. The Agency would take over the sites, plan and build the houses and sell them to the applicants.

Asked for descriptive particulars of the type of houses which the Agency would make available for the kind of money the Town Engineers said they would be sent detached or in blocks of four. The houses would contain a hall, living room, kitchen and dining room on the ground floor with three bedrooms and a bathroom on the first floor. Central heating would be provided for the principal part of the house which would be well insulated and would be one fireplace. Because there would be so many built-in presses and wardrobes a minimum of furniture would be required. The houses built by the Agency which he had seen were well up to standard and looked good.

The Council decided to send details of the application to the Agency and to await the outcome.

REARERS will recall reading in my article on the Moresby boat in Helvick last week that the crew of the Lifeboat at Ballincourt had gone to the vessel when she first entered the harbour on Christmas Eve 1969.

Now this is where the Helvick man came in. When word was flashed from the Coastguard Station at Ballincourt to the Station at Helvick that no crew could be mustered to take the Lifeboat out to the stricken Moresby, the news spread through Helvick and Ballincourt, and early on that stormy morning several young men, four or five of the locals left the Gaeltacht prepared to walk to the Old Bore to offer their services. They included Richie Tobin, Tomalain Droney and John Power, but it was they who were saved the seven mile hike when John Hegarty, an uncle of old Mrs. Charlie Skinn, who lived then in Ballincourt, latched up his horse and cart and drove them to town. They arrived too late, however, to be of any assistance as all the Dungarvan men had left on their errand of mercy. Nonetheless they showed their willingness to brave the elements and face the hazards of a raging sea.

That was in 1895. Three or four years later, the Lifeboat Station was shipped over to Helvick where it has remained to this day and the willingness of the Ring men compared with the refusal of the Ballincourt men at that time undoubtedly played a big part in influencing the Lifeboat Committee in making the decision to move the Lifeboat to the other side of the harbour.

Incidentally I was told that the Moresby put two anchors out in an effort to keep off the sandbank. One was retrieved and lay on Helvick pier for quite a number of years, the other still lies on the sandbank and fishermen shooting nets there are still wary of it and give the warning "look out for the Moresby's anchor." How the latter would be about her size, although Ring men who heard their fathers and grandfathers talk of her will tell you that she was the biggest ship that ever entered Dungarvan harbour.

Filling Station To Be Erected Opposite Ardkreen Hospital

A proposal to erect a petrol filling station opposite Ardkreen Hospital gate was referred to the County Council (the Planning Authority) stating that the Authority were objecting to the erection of the filling station on the grounds that it would constitute a traffic hazard and interfere with the amenities of the hospital.

A reply had been received from the Secretary, County Council, stating that permission had been granted by the Planning Authority to Mr. Robert Jepperson, Prospect, Newcastle, to erect the station and that the Authority could, if they wished, object to the station within a period of three weeks.

Mr. M. Morrissey said that if the County Council saw nothing wrong in granting permission there was surely no objection in their objecting any further.

Mr. C. Curran thought that they should pursue the matter and also get the views of the R.M.S. on the proposal.

Mr. M. Morrissey said that he had then and the County Council expressed the view that a filling station immediately opposite the hospital gate would lead to a greatly increased number of cars leaving the hospital and could involve them in accidents.
