WATERFORD COLLECT POINTS FROM N.F.L. GAME

Surprise Win Over Carlow

Waterford collected two points in the current National Football League with a surprising but well merited win over Carlow in their opening game played before a large attendance and in ideal conditions at the Fraher Field, Dungarvan, on Sunday last.

SATISFYING

Both sides were short some of their original line-out. Carlow were without the services of E. Fitzpatrick, C. Ryan and E. Walker, while Waterford fielded without Sean O'Riordan and Martin Kennedy.

FLYING START
Waterford got off to a flying start and were 2-2 up before Carlow broke through for their first score in the 14th minute. Up to this the Deise side had completely dominated the game with Geary and Tom Flynn dictating the terms at midfield. ARE WE BEING OVERPLANNED?

At the meeting of the County Council in Dungarvan Mr. Tom Lannen alleged that it was costing Local Authorities about £3 to spend every £1. This means that out of every £4 spent from monies collected from rates and taxes, £3 goes in administration and £1 goes to the public benefit. That Mr. Lannen's figures are approximately correct, I have no doubt, because questions on last year's Health Authority estimate show that practically three-fourths of the total went on salaries and expenses.

Without doubt the administration charges account for a far too high proportion of the total expenditure, but instead of attempting to streamline operations it looks as if these charges will become heavier if anything.

Mr. Lannen's remarks were made during a brief discussion on a letter from the Department of Local Government pointing out the County Council's statutory obligations under the Planning and Development Act 1963 to set up a Planning Authority for the County. Moves in this direction have already been turned down twice by the Council solely on economic grounds. No one denies that sensible planning is necessary for orderly development, but it seems to me that any rate that the requirement of the Act to ensure the rights of the citizen but my goodness a citizen would want to be legally protected and an expert on the Local Government Code if he was to be aware of what his rights are under all the Acts which have been enacted for his benefit?

Both the anchors used by the ship, he says, were brought to Waterford several years ago.

The argument as to how many masses the Muresby has been solved for me by Mr. Michael E. Curran, Ring who brought in an old composite photograph made by the late Mr. E. Keenan of 17, Main Street, Dungarvan, showing pictures of the ill-fated vessel, the Captain, his wife and those who lost their lives. This shows the ship to be a three-masted vessel, so that the contention, therefore, that the Council will decide once and for all question as to the need of this part of the controversy, otherwise for planning which was the source of controversy just for the county, is not to arise although Mich Tobin of Ballinapoll and more sense would have been.

NEW RESIDENCE QUALIFICATION FOR HOUSING PRIORITY LIST

Dungarvan Council's Decision

For the first time ever there will be in future a "residence clause" under which applicants for houses in the Dungarvan Urban area will have to qualify before being placed on the Housing Priority List.

This was unanimously agreed to at last Friday night's meeting of the Urban Council when the members came to decide the conditions for the Priority List to be drawn up for 1966.

The suggestion to insert the residence clause in the conditions came from the Chairman, Mr. T. A. Kyné, T.D., who said that it was most unfair that a married couple, say, with only one child, were waiting five years for a house in the town and then some people with a larger family come from outside and get a house before them.

Mr. Kyné said that during a discussion on Housing in the Dail the previous week, the Minister for Local Government more or less said that it was up to a Local Authority themselves whether they inserted such a clause in their letting regulations. "It can be done in Dublin," he said, "and it can be done in Waterford City so I can't see why we can't do it here. I feel that people who have been waiting here for houses for a number of years should have preference over the man just coming into the town."

Mr. Kyné then said that the usual residence clause called for a 5 years period but he thought a period of three years would be reasonable.

Mr. P. Whelan I think that's very fair.

Finally on the proposal of Mr. R. Walsh, seconded by Mr. N. Heckett, it was decided to amend all the existing regulations and to add the new residence regulations for the completion of the 1966 Priority List.
