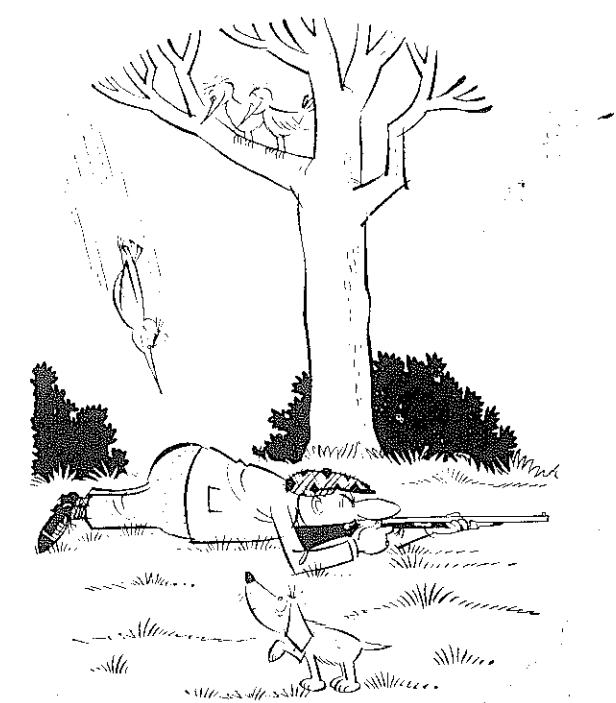

**150,000 Calves Vaccinated**  
The Calfhood Vaccination Scheme initiated by the Department of Agriculture on June 1st last year, under which 150,000 calves of 3 to 8 months in 11 counties of the East and South can be vaccinated free of charge against brucellosis, is being extended to the other 16 counties of the country. The scheme is voluntary and the 50,000 calves in the eleven counties have participated in the scheme in this first six months. It is hoped to achieve substantially higher figures next year.
