Last week members of Dungarvan Urban Council discussed the road network and the need for the County Engineer for the ordinary repair and maintenance of the ten miles of roads in the urban area. This looked for a sum of £22,500 in addition to the sum Urban Road Grant of £1,452 or a total of £3,952. Council members were indignant and rightly so at these charges and £1,452 stated by more than half the members of the Council were charging far too much for this work.

Arcing that the condition of much of the surface of the ten miles is nothing but good, but that in this last year over £20,000 has been spent on the urban roads, and that, as the York says, "ain't say?"


