## PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

**OUR COUNTY MANAGER**

As from the 1st April we are to have a new County Manager and his appointment was approved, though not without protest, at last Monday's quarterly meeting of the County Council. This column has in common with the County Council, which has been in existence for the past twenty-four months for the repeal or amendment of the County Management Act as we will see, and it will be interesting to see how the changes and proposed changes, especially the administration of the Health Services, the need for a County Manager in a small county such as Waterford is now superfluous.

However, the Minister for Local Government has rejected overtures by the Council and the appointment of a new County Manager is now a foregone conclusion. In the circumstances we must accept the Minister's decision and we will welcome the new Manager Mr. Charles O'Connor when he comes from County Meath to take up duty in six weeks time.

Mr. O'Connor's appointment was necessitated by the resignation of Mr. Simon J. Moynihan, who has been our County Manager since the County Management Act was passed in 1942. For the past twenty-four years his signature in Irish or public notices—S. J. Moynihan—has become most familiar to us all.

Mr. Moynihan's association with the County Council goes back much further than that. It was in 1934 following the petition of the County Council to the Government for the abolition of the County Council and the coming of the County Management Act in August 1942, the County Council was reconstituted following the local elections in that year, and Mr. Moynihan was appointed County Manager for the purpose of the County Council. He held this position until the Counties were grouped on April 1 last year, and following his retirement he was re-appointed Acting County Manager pending the selection and appointment of his successor.

This has now happened and Mr. Moynihan will shortly go into honorable retirement having served his Country and County Waterford well for a long number of years. We always found Mr. Moynihan courteous and approachable, and though at times we did not see eye to eye in the path we followed, he succeeded in differing with each other in an intelligent manner. Fortunately our only crosses against him were in his official capacity as County Manager, because in his private capacity we always found him to be a thorough Irish gentleman.

He leaves us as I say, having done a very fine job for over thirty years a job which has moved him to the top of the normal standards of the best County Managers in the country. His departure from the sphere of public service will be a great loss to the County.

Better Let Sleeping Dogs Lie

It is not a function of this body to get involved in the matter stated Mr. C. Curran, at the quarterly meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungarvan last Monday, when he ruled out a proposal made by Mr. P. **NOTHING WRONG**

At last Monday's meeting of the County Council, Mr. Cahill said that he wished to protest against the Bishop's action. He said nothing wrong or objectionable in the show. Teletis Bureau, he said, was a good service and as there was nothing objectionable in Saturday night's Show he thought the Bishop should not have interfered in the matter. As a matter of fact, said Mr. Cahill, I think we should congratulate Teletis Bureau.

Mr. Curran I don't think the Council could go that far. Mr. C. Heskin said that this was a matter in which the Council should not become involved. "Let sleeping dogs lie," he remarked.

Mr. Milo Gahey expressed the view that if the Bishop saw fit to write the show in his capacity as Spiritual Director, especially of the young people, then it was not for the Council to interfere in the matter by what the Bishop says.

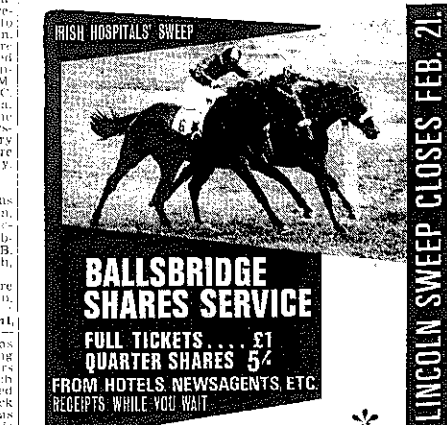
