## PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

**POBLACHT NA h-EIREANN**  
Fifty years ago on Easter Monday, April 24, 1916, while the "bank-holiday" was being celebrated along O'Connell Street, Dublin, in the warm Spring sunshine, a young man in the uniform of an Irish Volunteer stepped from the shadows of the doorway of the G.P.O. and into the street. He was a small, thin, dark-haired man, with a serious expression on his face. He was surrounded by a group of people gathered round and this is what they heard:

"Irishmen and Irishwomen, in the name of God and of the dead generations from which we receive our tradition of national freedom, I declare that we are this day reviving the Republic of Ireland."

"The Irish Republic is entitled to its freedom and its independence. It is the duty of every Irishman and Irishwoman to support it. We are hereby proclaiming the Republic as a Sovereign Independent State, and we pledge our lives and the lives of our children to its freedom and its independence."

## WELCOME FOR NEW COUNTY MANAGER

Mr. Charles A. O'Connor, Waterford's new County Manager, who has replaced the retiring Mr. J. J. O'Connell, was welcomed at the monthly meeting of the Waterford County Council on Monday evening last. Mr. O'Connor was introduced by Mr. P. Browne, Mayor of Waterford, Chairman of the Authority on behalf of all the members of the Council. Mr. O'Connor expressed the hope that the best of relations would always exist between the Council and the Mayor.

## THE COUNCIL'S WATER POLICY

At their meeting in Dungarvan last Monday, Waterford County Council unanimously agreed in principle to spend £50,000 a year as the initial outlay for the construction of a Water Supply Programme. The Council also agreed to set up a Water Supply Committee to advise on the availability of water which seems to be as scarce as snow in the present, despite the fact that Deputy John Kelly, who is in charge of the Water Supply Programme, has stated that the basic economy of the County is not sound.

## AT THIRTY MILES AN HOUR

The proposal by C.I.E. to close the Mallow Waterford Railway line which was discussed at last Monday's meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungarvan brings to mind a letter which I received recently from Mrs. Mary Kelleher, Dublin. Mrs. Kelleher is the wife of the late John P. Kelleher who was Station Master at Cappoquin from 1931 until he retired in 1951 and she found amongst his husband's papers an old record which recalls the opening of part of this line almost ninety years ago.

## THEY CHANGED THEIR MINDS

The determination of Pease and the other leaders of the 1916 rebellion in 1916 was so much prior to the rising that they had no time to consider the possibility of a change of mind. It is a terrible irony that the 1916 leaders who were so sure of their own rightness and who had such a high regard for their own actions, should have been so wrong in their own minds. George Russell (AE) who was one of the latter wrote some time after the rising and the executions:

"Their dream had left me numb and cold. But yet my spirit rose in pride. Refreshing in burlesque gold. The images of those who died Or were shut in the great cell. Here's to you, Pease, your dream not mine. Has turned life's waters into wine."

They further succeeded in getting the Council to agree to increase the grant from £500 to £1,200, the proposed increase being £700. The grant for the maximum allowed by Statute.
