## PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

**THE BY-ELECTION**  
The pace is quickening and political interest in the forthcoming by-election is mounting with each succeeding day. Activity too in the various political camps is being stepped up and the party machinery is being overhauled and geared for the fray.

Councillor Griffin was also a national teacher but the city had the overwhelming support of the Convention, drawing 32 votes to 4 for the Sinn Féin teacher which were cast in his favour by the local branch.
