PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

BACKWARD GLANCE
This week let us take a backward glance at last week's meeting. For the first time indeed it turned out to be at a number of centres before the polling stations finally closed at 9 p.m. on Wednesday night and the vital votes had all been cast.

Last week I commented on the gentlemanly manner in which the campaign had been conducted where the hostings were concerned and referred to the absence of the cut and thrust of old time elections. It is now clear that I spoke in season, for while what I said about the conduct of the parties where public meetings were concerned was correct up to that point and trust appears to have been reserved for the final day and the final hour of the final few hours of that day.

Massive is the only word I can think of to describe the operation mounted by both the major parties. The Fine Gael and Fine Gael, to get every possible supporter to the polling stations in Dungarvan but my assistants have told me that what happened there was a fair indication of the activities throughout the entire constituency. Both parties were served by veritable armies of workers inside and outside the booths, while there was no lack of transport. Cars with every conceivable decoration were seen to have converged on the constituency and the great numbers of the delivery and the election workers were as varied as the rainbow. In fact, what I mean, I mean, your lady told me she had her Wicklow at 7 o'clock that morning to be on her way at 9 o'clock and having worked throughout the day she was gone back to Waterford after the close of the poll on Thursday.

While everything started off in a spirit of camaraderie on election day but generated between the rival parties as the day wore on and tempers became frayed on a number of occasions, but fortunately none of the incidents which occurred developed into anything serious, thanks to the understanding handling of the workers by the official in charge.

HOW THE VOTES WENT
The Fine Gael candidate polled a total of 12,181 first preference votes as compared with 13,105 in the General Election of April last year, a drop of 925 votes in the period. The Fine Gael candidate with 5,617 votes improved his Party's position by 2,204 votes from 3,413 in the same period. That leaves us with the Labour Party's position. Last week they expressed disappointment at the returns when their candidate polled 6,783 votes but this compares favourably with the vote of 6,593 received by their sitting Member Deputy Kyrle in the 1965 General Election. Undoubtedly Labour were the poor party of this election. They were poor in everything that matters where winning a by-election seat is concerned. Their respect, literature and advertising. For that reason I think they did remarkably well in more than holding their own when it came to fighting the inane machinery of the other parties. I have here told that all the party had at its disposal in the way of party funds to fight the election in the Western end of the constituency was £180. This was a mere drop by comparison to what was apparently available to the major parties. And how did the Labour vote transfer? Fine Gael got 1,672 or roughly 25 per cent of

the total and Fine Gael got 3,561 or approximately 52 per cent. The number of non-voters of voters who are plumped with No. 1 for Labour was 1,550 or about 23 per cent. This represented the hard core of Labour supporters who adopted the policy of "a plague on both your houses" where the other two parties were concerned.

THE RESULT
Briefly I think that Emma Fall won the election because they went out to win it and put everything they had into it. They displayed a greater will to win in power than the combined opposition showed in wanting to dislodge them and their determination was the deciding factor in the long run. They realised it was going to be a close affair and they went for it. They had the favourable margin in the final count.

One other comment would like to make on this score is on the claim of the Labour Party candidate that he had swept the city taking 47 per cent of the votes, there I am not inclined to believe this as in fact there was a good Labour vote in the West of the constituency and it is hard to accept that such a popular man as the Emma Fall candidate must undoubtedly be in his own right a little more than 50 per cent of the city vote to share with his Fine Gael opponent who must also have received quite a big vote down there.

THE ESSAY
The result of the election here can now rightly be taken by the new Postmaster, Mr. Jack Lynch, as an endorsement of the free enterprise policy and a go ahead signal for his future proposals in his new capacity as an endorsement of the free member from Waterford he has got a loyal supporter and politics apart I think that the result as well as the city will have a 2nd Dail Deputy and on that score I congratulate him on his victory.

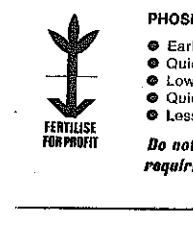
