A GENERAL CONTRIBUTION
Within the next few months the Finance Department of our various local authorities will be busy engaged preparing their estimates for the coming year. Already the Health Authority Committees are in record and these have announced increases of varying degrees, ranging from 2 1/2% to 5%.

There is no way under the present rating structure that local taxation can be reduced and there is no use in authorities making requests to the local authorities to reduce the rates as long as they are based on the existing system.

Is there any useful suggestion to reduce the system? I have always felt that in these times that the placing of the full burden of local taxation on householders and landowners alone is unfair and unreasonable. A system more in line with the Income Tax code would I feel be more equitable.

It must surely be accepted that the services and amenities provided by the local authorities are not a luxury but a necessity to enable us to live in a modern society. The services of water and sewerage, to name but a few, are enjoyed not only by householders and landowners, but by every member of the community. Would it not be fairer that the general burden should be borne by all wage-earners in ratio to their incomes rather than by just rated occupiers alone who must form the majority of the wage and salary earning community.

With the present high wages being earned by practically everyone in employment today I think that it is only proper that all should contribute to the cost of running local services. It is a matter of fact that a number of these people earning big money have less responsibility than many householders and other rated occupiers and their contributions would go a long way towards easing the going's burden.

POLITICAL INQUESTS
The political inquests into the result of the December election here are still going on and the various newspapers provided the topic of their editorial discussion over the Christmas holidays.

The Government were naturally jubilant that they scored victories both here and in the South Kerry constituency where the Fine Gael Party were also quickly pleased by the progress their first preference votes showed they had made. However there has been much criticism of the "failure" of the Labour Party, particularly in Waterford, where at one stage some of the political commentators in pre-election forecasts were tipping the party to win a seat.

These commentators all write in Dublin daily and Sunday papers and all kinds of wild allegations, even to the extent of the sacking of the Party Secretary and the resignation of the Party Leader have been made. The Labour leaders have been criticised for advocating a "Labour only vote" in the by-election and in this regard they have been blamed by the "The Gael Party" for "losing" the election as the non-transfer of the 1,300 Labour former votes was generally accepted as a big factor in the ultimate narrow

win of the Fine Gael candidate. While this may be so in the view of the Fine Gael Party, the point still remains that the Labour Party, in my mind, did remarkably well against the "blitz" which was carried out by the Government and Fine Gael parties in the by-election and especially in polling day.

I have been looking over a chart of the distribution of the votes prepared from notes made by shrewd political observers who watched the opening of the ballot boxes and followed the count. These show that in the city the vote between the three candidates was fairly evenly divided with Mayor Browne holding a slight advantage. These figures do prove the claim of the Labour candidate Mr. Griffin that he had swept the city taking 47% of the votes.

In the county Mayor Browne again won the advantage on a 5:4 ratio to his opponents Mr. Collins and Mr. Griffin. Mr. Collins and Mr. Griffin held their own with Mr. Browne both polling over 700 while Mr. Collins' vote is indicated as being in the region of 600. It is amazing, if the figures are anyway true, that Labour did so extremely well in Dungarvan against such out and out opposition and again they dispelled the claims of the Dublin political writers.

Frankly I believe that the by-election gave us a clear indication of the present political temperature of the country. The Government may have a good strategy and a perfectly geared organisation. The same situation would not be so in a general election when the "big guns" who blitzed us for the by-election would be minding their own backyards. Time alone will tell if this opinion is correct.

THE PARISH OF CAPPOQUIN
Appropos my article in last week's issue on "The Parish of Cappoquin," Mr. O'Leary, Cappoquin, who is the Parish Priest, writes to tell me that the "Parish of Cappoquin" is a work of the late Canon Power. I was indeed delighted to learn this as there was no indication of authorship in the volume which was published in 1912. Mr. O'Leary refers me in a further volume "Waterford and Lismore" published by Canon Power in 1937 which the author writes as follows: "The present work is not a mere revision, nor even a re-edition of the 'Parish of Cappoquin' which was published in 1912. It is in fact a new and independent work although necessarily it incorporates practically all the material of the older book."

In 1950 Canon Power produced a further volume, "The Parish and Diocese of Cappoquin" to mark the centenary of the founding of the Parish and in this he gives 1950 as the date of the establishment of Cappoquin Parish. This additional information to that contained in the 1912 volume, from which I quoted last week, was Bishop Sylvester Joyce of Waterford, a Franciscan, who constituted Cappoquin an independent Parish in that year with Fr. Michael Keating, a grand-nephew of the great Irish historian, Fr. Geoffrey Keating, as pastor.

Bringing the succession of Pastors more up to modern times the 1950 volume records that Very Rev. Philip Dunphy was appointed Pastor in 1903 and was elevated to the Diocesan Chapter and died in 1927 and was succeeded in that year by Canon Denis Whelan, a native of Dungarvan.

Caution (Whelan died in 1934 and was succeeded by Very Rev. Thomas Fitzgerald and he died in 1942 and was succeeded by Very Rev. John O'Connor whose tragic death followed within a couple of months of his appointment. Very Rev. P. P. McGrath who was transferred from the parish and died in 1944. He was followed by Very Rev. Canon Kennedy.

It is interesting to note also in regard to the parochial history of Cappoquin that the Boys' School was built, heeded in 1922 and was succeeded by Very Rev. John O'Connor whose tragic death followed within a couple of months of his appointment. Very Rev. P. P. McGrath who was transferred from the parish and died in 1944. He was followed by Very Rev. Canon Kennedy.
