O'Connor states that in a circular issued by the Minister for Local Government in 1965, the local authorities were strongly urged to have a comprehensive review carried out of the rents of their local housing stock with a view to the introduction of a rental structure by which tenants would pay rents related to their family and financial circumstances in the most equitable and amenable of the accommodation which they occupied.
 The houses covered by the Manager's proposals include Congress Villas, Mitchell Terrace, the houses on the terrace, Brigid Terrace, Garvan's Terrace, St. Monica's Terrace, Clonety Terrace, St. Patrick's Terrace, Cathal Terrace, Fitzgibbon Terrace, Fitzgibbon Terrace, Keating Street, Westera Terrace, Murphy Place and Caseyville. The Manager's report stresses that there is sometimes a general feeling that any revision of rents automatically results in an increase in rents for all tenants. This was not so and it was not the intention of the officials to do this. The aim was that rents should be about one-third of the total income in cases where incomes varied from £20 to £25 per week the percentage would be about one-quarter to apply. At the same time the report stated that it would be true to say that the adoption of the proposed scales would mean increased rents for a very substantial number of tenants and that the following would be assumed an average wage of £10 per week with four dependants. This would be about 5 per week. This increase is regarded as 40p less and it is a rate of 1 per week per £20 of income. The report said that a very significant number of tenants would benefit by reductions of up to 45p per week from 6d. to 5 per week scaled up to the increase in the same way as the increase in the

LESS THAN TEN SHILLINGS
 Dealing with the present rent structure the report set out that 85 per cent of the existing rents were less than 10 per week while the standard wage in the town was about £10 per week. Some tenants receiving social welfare benefits were paying a substantially greater proportion of their income on rent than those in full employment. Perhaps some of the family members also working. The report that the actual rate levied by the current rents to cover the deficit in housing accounts was equivalent to 4.4d. in the £. Under the present rental structure this subsidy would be reduced to 2.4d. in the £ in the next few years.


