PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

END OF THE LINE
 The week-end marks the closing of the Mallow-Waterford line and for the first time in almost seventy years, the rail line between the two towns will be closed. The closure of the line has been strongly opposed all along its length but every representation made to keep it open, since the decision was taken by the Government and the Board of C.I.E. to close it, has been arbitrarily rejected. And now we have reached the end of the line as it will officially close on Saturday, March 25 from which date it will cease to function. What will the effect of the closure be? Most certainly a big increase in road traffic, particularly traffic of the heavy type which is bound to make the roads between Waterford, Dungarvan and Mallow a greater nightmare than ever; in all probability a more difficult system of public transport, especially for the older generation who will find the alternative bus routes, especially in winter-time, less accommodating; and certainly a further proposition for merchants and shopkeepers who in every town between Mallow and Waterford, served by the line, relied on rail transport to deliver their goods. There are those, too, of course who will welcome the closure of the line. Amongst these especially will be farmers whose accommodation roads to their dwellings in many instances crossed the railway line and who ran the risk of serious accident almost every day while trains ran on the line. I feel though, no matter what type we look at it, that the

closure of the line is a mistake and that it is one that the majority will yet regret in the years ahead.

URBAN RATES
 The Dungarvan Urban Council held their estimates meeting on Wednesday night, but at the time of writing all I know is that the estimate submitted by the County Manager totals £55,988 and calls for a rate of 6/3d. In the £, an increase of 4/6d. over last year. The Town Services up by 2/7d. The greatest single increase in the budget is for housing £1,100, caused mainly by the inclusion of a sum of £6,330 estimated by the Town Engineer to put the houses in the Council's housing estate in a proper state of repair and which was included at the request of the Council. PREPARING FOR THE FRAY
 In about three months time the local elections will take place and already most of the political parties have nominated their candidates in the four electoral areas for the County Council, and for the Urban Councils and Town Commissioners where these bodies function. With the nomination of the principal parties selected for the Dungarvan area of the County Council there is at present a total of fifteen candidates to be named on the voting paper—four for Labour, four for Fine Gael, two for Sinn Féin and five for Fianna Fáil. The latter party were last in the field and made their selections at a convention of the Dungarvan Committee held at Ormonde last Sunday night. Contrary to expectations there were no great surprises at the Convention and by unanimous decision, the outgoing

candidates Mr. Charles Curran, Glasheen, who is Chairman of the Council and Mr. Sean Whelan, Kilsnoey, Ballinacully, were chosen without a contest. Three other members of the party were selected to stand following a vote and in order of choice, these were Mr. Tim Barry, Ballyharran, Dungarvan, a well-known farmer who got 34 votes, Mr. Nicholas Kelly, Devonshire Arms Hotel, Dungarvan, who got 28 votes and Mr. Teddy Kennally, P.O. Aghis, another well-known farmer and G.A.A. personality who got 34 votes. Two former County Council members of the party, Mr. Bobby Kenny, Annetree, Dungarvan and Mr. Jim Mansfield, farmer, Glaswilliam, Orange, were unsuccessful in their bids to win nominations of the Convention.
