ERTIFIED SEED POTATOES
Farmers are advised to plant certified seed potatoes. Certified seed is the produce of disease-free stock which are grown in isolation away from diseased potato crops and which were found to be free from the potato blight of Potato Root Eelworm, starchy tubers can be used for planting in any district of origin in Ireland. A reliable indication of the quality of certified seed potatoes are in sacks sealed with an official seal in red metal. In addition, the sacks are branded with the variety of the potato and the number of the grower. The price of certified seed potatoes is available and prices reasonable. Farmers are advised to purchase their requirements and to plant as early as possible. Sacks should be placed in a cool, dry place with local merchants or potato stores.

PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

BEAUTIFYING DUNGARVAN
The major project of the Dungarvan Junior Chamber of Commerce in their "Dungarvan Beautifying Scheme" is the improvement of the town's central square. The scheme has commenced and the first stage is the painting of the shop fronts in an assortment of tints which will brighten the town and make the square a pleasant and colourful centre for the town.
It should be noted that the town's appearance is a matter of pride to the town's people and it will undoubtedly give a new look to the town.
The Dungarvan Junior Chamber, although only one year old in Ireland has already made its mark and in doing so has put Dungarvan on the map not only as a tourist and entertainment centre but as a town with a multitude of industrial interests. In the past year the Chamber has been responsible for the running of the Industrial Exhibition, the Irish Week, Debates and many other functions, all most successfully.
Last week they held their first annual dinner and here again in all their other undertakings the mark of success was evident. The dinner was superbly chosen, the cuisine and service left nothing to be desired and the organization of the cabaret and dance was shown to be of a high standard. It was indeed a most successful function.
During the course of his after dinner speech the President of the Junior Chamber, Mr. A. V. Maher, referred to other projects which they had in mind for the town's beautifying scheme for the Square. The idea of these was an anti-litter campaign and it was hoped that everyone will join with me in the beautifying of the town's streets on this occasion but despite the fact that the town's beautifying service is now costing £250 or a sum of something like that, it is a small price to pay for the improvement of the town's appearance. The situation has been gradually improving. Indeed there would be little to be said about the shops on the Square in an effort to land a tidy town and to beautify the streets are to remain littered as they are at present.
Another project mentioned by the President was the development of the Pollan estuary. Inside the old mill race a bridge into a boating lake. This has been the ambition of many in the past but it is now usually being classified merely as a pipe dream. There are, however, a number of technical difficulties where this project is concerned but I am sure where there is a will there is a way and the project will surely be found.
The third major project with which the Junior Chamber members are at present tussling is the establishment of a Civic Centre in the town. This, I think, is a matter of major importance and one which should be readily followed by all civic-minded people in the town and district.
The old Town Hall is in a near ruinous condition and cannot be said to provide any of the facilities which are called for in this modern age. Because of its dilapidated condition the estimated income from the hall for the coming year shows a drop of more than £200 and as a result its maintenance will cost over £400 on the rates. In his report to the Urban Council at their recent annual estimates meeting the County Manager referred to the Town Hall problem as follows: "The expenditure on the Town Hall is a considerable reduction in income due to the falling off in the number of dances held there during the current year. It is considered that in order to put the Town Hall in proper condition a substantial repairs job is necessary and in view of the falling off in its use the question must be asked whether such a programme would be of any economic or social value to the town."
Dungarvan as the County's administrative centre should have a building for civic functions worthy of it. The young men and women and boys and girls of the town and district should also be provided with a centre where they can meet for the various forms of indoor sports and amusement and other cultural activities so necessary in these modern times.
