**OLD PARISH AND AGLISH YOUTHS SUCCESSFULLY APPEAL AGAINST DETENTION SENTENCES**  
Sequel To Tallow Dance Hall Row

Two young men who were each sentenced to two months detention at St. Patrick's in Tallow District Court, on March 10, successfully appealed against the sentences of Detention District Court, on Tuesday last.

They were John Power (20, Barranstock Old Parish, and James Tobin (19, Curranraha, Aglish). Power was sentenced for an assault on John Murphy, Mountain Ring, while Tobin was convicted for assaulting John Noel O'Donnell, Losherran, Tallow, on Wednesday, January 18.

Judge Fawcett allowed the appeals but substituted fines of £5 in each case. Dr. D. R. Cunnahan, State Solicitor, stated that the aggressors and the aggressed appeared to be in two gangs and once appeared to be as bad as the other. He described as "a dancin' riot" the assault on John Murphy, Tallow, who was made a prisoner on the morning of January 19. He was on duty at the Arch Ballroom and saw two young men who he later identified as Tobin and Power, who were stronger and was making determined efforts to strike around and trying to duck the blows. He caught Tobin who tried to get away and a crowd gathered round him.

Witnesses said that he then asked both men to go with him to the Garda Station where they reached the door Tobin ran away. Later in the night Power was seen in the dance hall. At about 1 a.m. John Murphy approached and said that he had been assaulted by Power in the upper lip where he said he had received a blow. No farmer is compelled or pressured to join. His yearly subscription will be less than that paid by a member of a trade union and headed according to the Poor Law Valuation of his holding. The N.F.O. is in fact the "chancellor" for Irish farmers—fearlessly on their side.

**What Has The N.F.A. Achieved For Farmers?** Installed a hope and a greater sense of pride and self-respect on a national scale a sense of value of organised, disciplined effort.
