PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

FATEFUL DAYS
Due to the outbreak of Foot and Mouth Disease which has been scourging the livestock of Britain since it made its first appearance on a Shropshire farm on October 25 last, this country is now in a veritable state of siege. Our Department of Agriculture has taken every precautionary measure to ensure that every thing humanly possible is being done to prevent the animal plague from spreading to Ireland. These are fateful days for the country as not only does the welfare of our farmers but of us all hang in the balance as we watch the frighteningly rapid with which the disease has spread over the western and north-eastern shores of England and Wales. The vast situation of the virus in little over a month has now made the outbreak the worst ever experienced in Britain.

Wherever farmers and indeed urban dwellers gather these days the conversation is never very far before it embraces the awful prospects of the spread of the disease to this country. There is no shortage of theories as to how the disease has spread in the present instance and indeed there is no end to the possibilities. In the first instance there is the sick animal which is carried to a place where it comes in contact with fields, hedges, buildings and other livestock within the infected region become covered with a thick mucus and this can be spread by dogs, wild animals and birds. Every person who even walks in a field which has become contaminated stains everything with which he comes in contact. It can, therefore, be readily understood how almost completely helpless man is to prevent the spread of the disease while it can be equally readily understood why the country is in an urgent need for the observance of every precaution. We are not only being visited from the source of the plague and maximum security measures are being taken to prevent its escape. At the moment it appears to be virtually certain that entry of the disease, if it does come, will be through a human agency. It is the one course if this is to be avoided is for everyone coming into the country to submit fully to the disinfecting regulations and to provide with sufficient immunity to prevent its spread at the ports of entry. If all these regulations are complied with the disease will remain an urgent one which should not be put on the long finger by the local authority.

A DANGEROUS ROAD
A fatal accident at Young Road, Dunganarvan, in which a young man recently lost his life when the car he was driving went out of control and struck an E.S.B. pole, prompted members of the jury at the inquest to bring in a rider requesting that this particular pole be moved.

It is more than a coincidence that not so long previously another motorist had a miraculous escape in practically similar circumstances at the same place while yet again another motorist, this time travelling in the opposite direction, also found his car out of control not far from the spot.

I have been looking at this stretch of road and find that it has a smooth, almost polished surface which on wet days could well prove a hazard to motorists entering the town at

COUNCIL TO RAISE LOANS FOR HOUSING AND SEWERAGE SCHEMES

At their monthly meeting last Monday night, Dunganarvan Urban Council on the proposal of Mr. T. Kye, T.D., seconded by Mr. J. Conolly, unanimously agreed to raise a loan of £25,000 to finance the building of the proposed Abbey side sewerage scheme. The loan would be repaid over a period of 10 years at 6 per cent interest. Mr. J. G. Dowling, Deputy County Manager, said that the cost per house would approximately be £2,500.

SMALL DWELLINGS GRANT WORK
On the proposal of Mr. J. Conolly, seconded by Mr. J. Conolly, the Council agreed to raise a loan of £25,000 to cover the cost of the Sewerage Scheme at the Abbey side.

SEWERAGE SCHEME
The Council also agreed on the proposal of Mr. Kye, seconded by Mr. Conolly, to raise a loan of £25,000 to cover the cost of the Sewerage Scheme at the Abbey side.

GRANT WORK
A letter from the Department of Public Works, Dublin, dated 21st November, advised that the Council had been granted a grant of £1,500 (£1,300 last year) on the payment of a local contribution of £2,000 (£1,650 last year).

The Acting Town Clerk said that the money would be used to continue the sewerage work which would start about the first week in December and ten or twelve men would be employed while the money lasted.
