BUY QUALITY IRISH
With a good week of shopping Spree is entering its climax and the message is to get over to retailers this week the need to support Irish industries and manufacturers.
We should all make a point of asking for Irish goods and where they are equal in quality and price to their imported counterparts then we should give them preference. The slogan for all this Christmas therefore should be "buy quality Irish goods."
The public are particularly well served on this score when it comes to buying Christmas cards. Millions of these greeting cards pass across the counters each Christmas but only an infinitesimal number of these are those made in Ireland. Irish made Christmas cards can compare favourably with those imported types in design, content and variety.
GOOD NEWS
As promised last week I am able to report good news about the factory which is being built on the site of the old factory at Clonea, Dungarvan. The American side has been cleared and it is just the legal aspects in closing the purchase of the 60-acre site which the factory will occupy at Clonea which remains to be completed.
It is expected that building on the factory site will commence about February and from there it will only remain to have the building completed and equipped before the industrial process to be carried out there commences. It is estimated that the factory will provide jobs for about 100 when it becomes operational.

DUNGARVAN FOOTPATHS
I bring good news to the residents of Lower Main Street in Dungarvan about their footpaths. Earlier this year Frank Hall brought his full support to bear on the question started by the residents to have their footpaths, which are undoubtedly in a deplorable state of repair when he featured the matter in "Newstalk."
At that time a promise was made to have the paths repaired by the months of January and by nothing was done. A few weeks ago I again took up the matter and Mr. Hall once more threw his weight behind the plight of the residents. At the last meeting of the Urban Council the present financial year the estimate for repairs to footpaths had been sent, despite the public assurance given to the contrary to Mr. Hall.

A COSTLY SERVICE
There seems to be no end to the upward spiral in the cost of our Health Services. To call it a "free" health service is very far from true. At present it costs the ratepayers of County Waterford 25 1/2 in the pound and the bill that will be placed before the Waterford Health Authority when they meet in Dunmore next Tuesday to consider the annual estimate for the next financial year promises to add an additional 5/- in the £ to this already colossal account. This is a very far cry from the 2/6 in the £ which we were told a free health service would cost when the Health Services Act was first introduced.
