CONSTITUTIONAL REFORM

The report of the all-party Parliamentary Committee on Constitutional Reform has been published. It is a document of considerable importance and should be read by all concerned with the future of the Republic.

The Committee's proposals are based on the principle of a unitary system of government, with a strong Executive and a weak Legislature. It also proposes a system of proportional representation for the Dáil Éireann.

The Committee's proposals are a departure from the traditional British system of government, but they are a necessary step towards a more democratic and efficient form of government for the Republic.

A DEVALUED POUND

The Government's proposal to devalue the pound is a move which will have far-reaching effects on the Irish economy. It is a move which will increase the price of imports and reduce the price of exports.

The Government's proposal is based on the principle of a floating exchange rate, but it is a move which will have a deflationary effect on the economy.

POLITICAL FLUTTERINGS

The political scene in the Republic is one of considerable uncertainty. The Government's proposals for constitutional reform have been met with a mixture of support and opposition.

The Labour Party has been particularly vocal in its opposition to the proposals, but other parties have also expressed their doubts.

SPEED LIMIT ALTERATIONS

The Garda Síochána has proposed a series of alterations to the speed limits on the roads in the Republic. The proposals are based on the principle of a uniform speed limit of 30 m.p.h. for all roads.

The proposals are a move towards a more rational and efficient system of speed limits, but they will have a significant impact on the motoring community.

No Money For Water Schemes

When Waterford County Council decided last year to finance the regional water schemes, it was met with a policy of protracted delay. The Council decided to spend a sum of £50,000 annually until all demands were met.

This policy decision was referred to the monthly meeting of the Council in December when it was agreed that the Council should send a representation to the Minister for the Environment and Planning.

The Minister's reply was a disgraceful and outrageous one, and the Council has decided to take the matter to the courts.

DEPUTATION FROM RING AND GAELTACHT ROADS AREA

Mr. Sean Whelan introduced a deputation consisting of Mr. Edward Ryan and Mr. Maurice Kelly to the County Council. The deputation was to request the Council to declare the Ring and Gaeltacht roads as a public road.

The Council agreed to the proposal, and the roads will be declared as public roads on 1st February.
