VEKED QUESTION
The appointment of agricultural instructors by the County Agricultural Committee of Dungarvan has been a very vexed question for many years now. Some of the most heated and most important discussions at meetings of the committee have centred around the subject and it was a live topic as ever when the committee met for their monthly meeting in Dungarvan last Monday.

At the January meeting a few weeks ago the instructor who was doing temporary duty in East Waterford tendered his resignation and the Committee decided then by seven votes to six not to replace him. That appeared to be a valid decision and it was followed by a vote of seven to six in favour of a further resolution, carried by seven votes to six, that the Committee should appoint another temporary instructor.

This temporary policy does not project the image of the Committee as being very stable or permanent and the public cannot be blamed for feeling that the members of the Committee are merely juggling with the numbers in which first one man is appointed and then another at the first subsequent opportunity.

It is a pity that the Committee should be in a position to have to do this. The Committee has arranged for a staff of seven instructors, including the Chief Agricultural Officer and the public have not taken up duty until the last summer. Through the Committee decided to fill the Kilmeachonnan centre by the County Manager and Executive Staff of the Council for the coming year.

I understand that as matters stand there will be another very close examination in which every possible cut will be made without interfering with the essential services the Committee has to provide. The Committee has to provide a permanent advisory service for the farmers without having to make any additional appointment.

The danger of blame cannot be pointed at any members of the Committee because two of the appointments which they have approved are not filled. As I have said already, the blame for this must be laid at the door of the Local Appointments Committee.

IT'S CHEAPER at MOLONEYS BEEF EXPORT Guarantee SCHEME

The Minister for Agriculture and Fisheries announces that as from Monday, 5th February, a producer selling fat bullocks or heifers direct to a meat factory for slaughter for export to Britain may, if he so wishes, have the best export subsidy paid to himself by the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries.

In order to obtain payment of the subsidy direct from the Department, the producer must—
(a) complete a special application form obtainable at any meat factory or at any District Veterinary Office, requesting that the subsidy be paid to him by the Department. The completed form and the animal's identity cards must accompany the animal to the factory.
(b) sell the animals to the meat factory on a price basis exclusive of subsidy.
To be eligible for subsidy the animals must comply with the existing minimum carcass specifications under the Beef Export Guarantee Scheme (these specifications are shown on the application form). Examination of carcasses for eligibility for subsidy is carried out by officers of the Minister stationed at each meat factory and their decision is final.
Bullocks and heifers may still continue to be sold to a meat factory on the basis that the factory will receive the subsidy. The rate of subsidy payable each week will be announced by the Department in advance. The rate payable to the producer will be the rate announced for the week of delivery of the animals to the factory. The same rate of subsidy will be payable to the factory in respect of eligible carcass beef exported to Britain during the same week, over and above the quantities on which producers elect to have the subsidy paid direct to themselves.
