TIDY TOWNS

If you live in Dungarvan and practically all the other towns in County Waterford which have entered this year's Tidy Towns Competition, you will have to make a huge effort to overcome the litter problem which at present is the most serious appearance.

This problem of litter has been the greatest single mark against the town since the competition was initiated. Unfortunately there has been no improvement where this is concerned, rather has the problem become more aggravated and more serious.

If anything, litter has increased since the competition was started. It is a matter of fact that the litter strewn throughout the town is a disgrace.

If local communities are not prepared to cooperate more with local authorities in an all-out effort to clean up our towns then it is completely futile to enter the competition.

Each of the towns in recent years for the audits and the slightly appearance of our streets has been directed against the Urban and County Councils who operate the sweeping services but there is little use in an efficient bin collection of refuse if people come subsequently and throw paper wrappers and containers all over the place.

The number of public general and shopkeepers and traders in particular realise that the litter problem is one in which they must directly interest themselves. If we are to clean up our streets, the best way is to get the public to do it.

Within the last few weeks I have noticed many of the principal streets in Dungarvan in a dreadful condition. Papers of all kinds, wrappers, paper bags and small containers were strewn everywhere and the appearance of the town was one of careless untidiness.

While the Urban Council sweeping service may not be completely blameless for this the shopkeepers and indeed the public generally must also contribute to the problem. A section of the town which is so clean and tidy appears to have no idea whatever of cleanliness and who goes into shops to buy sweets, fancy goods and chips and then come to the streets and discard the wrappings without caring one iota about the overall result.

This shows a great lack of pride and as long as an attitude of this kind prevails there is little use in entering a Tidy Towns Competition. At the town will be as dirty and as trim and neat as the residents wish.

It is to be no more or no less. It is therefore a matter of great importance that we should for this is the only way that can be solved. Apart from any Tidy Towns Competition, a native pride should urge us to live in a town where by common effort we help to project its best possible image.

CAPPOQUIN MILK PRODUCERS MEET
Concern At Management Committee's Attitude

A very largely attended meeting of milk producers in the Cappoquin area was held at the Parochial Hall, Cappoquin, on Tuesday evening, March 19th. The meeting was sponsored by the local Milk Producers Association. Mr. T. D. Fives presided and Mr. T. Murphy acted as secretary to the meeting.

A full and frank discussion took place on the unsatisfactory prevailing price for milk and the general uncertainty of the economy of the industry in the area.

Producers in more progressive country areas are presently receiving 3d. to 5d. per gallon more for their milk together with better productive services such as diagnostic, bulk milk and bulk milk deliveries, specialised veterinary advice, etc., etc.

It was felt that given the proper encouragement, confidence and financial return to the producer—the Cappoquin area would become one of the most intensive milk producing areas in the South.

The meeting expressed great concern at the refusal of the local Society's Management Committee to meet the producers to discuss problems within the society, a situation which has led to producers demanding permission to supply their milk to Waterford Co-Op.
