## COMPULSION WON'T WORK SAYS FINE GAEL SPEAKER

Even if there are some shortcomings in our present electoral laws and that is not apparent to the eyes of the public, the dangerous proposals mooted by the government, anyone who has the sense for words, was the anticipation of a fine Gael speaker, Mr. J. The more recent efforts of the government to impose penalties and discipline on the workers, and the engaged in industrial disputes, also failed because such compulsion is in conflict with our Irish temperament.

**WASTE OF TIME AND MONEY**
