## Behind the Spotlight

### FINANCIAL RESTRAINT

A call for restraint in the matter of wage and salary claims has been made by the Taoiseach and the Central Bank has made a further restraint in lending. The rise in public expenditure, the increased borrowing requirements of the Government have both so far significantly exceeded the budgeted expectations of the Central Bank and the main Banks. In a letter to the Bank Standing Committee the Associated Banks have been requested accordingly to reserve available credit as strictly as possible for productive purposes and to restrain attempts to be in direct conflict with the attitude of the Taoiseach towards fresh demands for increases tends only to compound the situation.

At this stage, a meeting of Waterford County Council, raised a claim for a nine per cent. rise for unmet officers employed by the Council who considered and accepted a very strenuous case made in favour of the increase by the County Manager. The Council rejected it by a majority of almost 10 to 1. No provision was made for an increase in the current estimates of the Council and to meet an additional cost of £2,000,000, an application was made to the County Manager on the end of the financial year next March while a further £7,500 would be needed for next year.

To meet the cost of the new building for the Central Bank, a sum of £168,837 this year, the County Council stated that they anticipated the amount of this year's increase against possible savings.

At the same time, the Committee informed that their general financial position had deteriorated to the extent of about £220,000 compared with the same period last year, they now owed the bank £182,290 as compared with £168,837 this year.

It is abundantly evident that no private business could be run in the same manner as the County Council and surveillance by the Central Bankers generally are run in a completely different way to a private enterprise. However, with the head of the Government calling for restraint in the demand for higher wages and the Central Bank advising restraint in credit, except for essential services, it looks anomalous that employees in the public service, notwithstanding these similar conditions, proposed large increases.

There is a general clamour to increase more money and increase following the increase in the civil service, grows and there is a continuing desire to increase the amount of money in the civil service circle. In fact, there is an attraction when it is going on. It is a sign of the supreme evils of a prosperous economy and in the long run it is the poor who destroy any more towards savings as people realise that money has a declining value and that the present price of a day will be worth very much less even a few years.

I think that the position is that any increase in the interests of the country should be served if we could learn to put down before self-interest that the better everyone realises this the better it will be for all.
