FINANCIAL RESTRAINT

A call for restraint in the matter of wage and salary claims has been made by the Central Bank in a letter to the Chairman of the Irish Bankers' Association.

The general public is causing the Government to have second thoughts as to its overall attitude towards the problem of wages.

As this week's meeting of the National Council of the Irish Bankers' Association has been opened by the Chairman of the Council, Mr. J. J. O'Connell.

At the same time the Council was informed that their general financial position had deteriorated to the extent of almost £20,000 compared with the same period last year.

It is patently evident that no private business could be run in the same manner as the Central Bank and its subsidiaries.

Up to the present, the introduction of Standard Time has had very little to recommend it and the growing reaction of the public is causing the Government to have second thoughts as to its overall attitude towards the problem of wages.

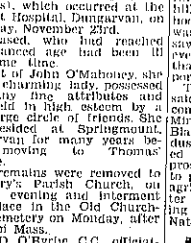

DEPUTATION CLAIMS "WE ARE A FORGOTTEN PEOPLE"

Complaints About Boreens

Mr. Marshall Tobin, a member of a deputation which attended the quarterly meeting of Waterford County Council last Monday, told the members we find we are a forgotten people and are being left to literally addle our own brains. The deputation which was introduced by Mr. Sean Whelan, complained about the atrocious condition of the Boreen at Graven Modugno (it was stated that the boreen had not been taken over by the Council but they asked that it now be taken over).

Mr. Tobin said that five families living on the boreen were completely water logged and the water was so high that it was difficult to get to school even in Wellingtons in wet weather as there was usually between 6 and 8 inches of water on the boreen and it fell into a potatoe the size of their Wellingtons. He said that the farmers there could not get their potatoes to the market because the boreen was so high that they had to use a bullock cart to take them to the market. The cause of the boreen was that water was diverted on to it from the main road and this had been done by the County Council workers.

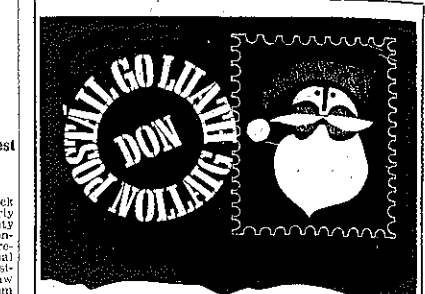
