ROAD SAFETY
 Despite all the appeals for the observance of more safety measures on the roads, the number of fatal traffic accidents which occurred on Irish roads during the past twelve months has shown a sharp upsurge. The pattern thrown up by the bulk of the fatalities is a peculiar one in that it shows that but a small percentage result from drunken driving and that the most likely places where these accidents occur are on wide, straight stretches of road. These two factors would indicate that the main cause of violent deaths on our roads is not drunken drivers but excessive speeds, irresponsibility and sheer lack of care. We may of course add to these the increase of heavy traffic on the roads; large, slow moving articulated lorries and bulk carriers which clutter up the roads more and more, throw up barriers for fast moving powerful cars, capable of high speeds put down the foot and shoot off. It is tragic that in so many cases when they do this that they catapult themselves and many others into the cold arms of death. Because of the ever-increasing number of road deaths I know that readers will bear with me when I appeal to drivers and especially to those of the younger generation to take more care on the roads. It is far better to take things easy and arrive than to wind up in hospital or the morgue at speed.

SANK IN ARDMORE BAY

 The resolution passed by Waterford County Council on the proposal of Mr. Austin Deasy last Monday requesting Coras Iompair Breasa to re-open the Dungarvan Railway Station and to provide a rail service for the carriage of goods between Waterford and Dungarvan is one to which I hope C.I.B. will give renewed consideration. It is only since the line closed that people have meant to realize what a loss it has meant not only from the point of view of business but more important, the traffic congestion and chaos which has built up on the roads and the streets of our towns since.

COUNTY COUNCIL REFERS BACK HEALTH ESTIMATE
Terrifying Impact on Rates

Waterford County Council, at their monthly meeting in Dungarvan last Monday, unanimously agreed to refer back to the Waterford Health Authority the provisional estimate for the coming year which provides for the gross expenditure of £1,818,370 and which the Authority provisionally estimated when the estimate was presented to them last month. The Council suggested that the Authority might agree to spread the repayment of their debt balance of £91,750 over a longer period.

Mr. C. Curran, Chairman, said that the impact on the rates this year would be terrifying and they would have to look for higher grants from the Department.

Mr. J. Quirk then suggested that the payment of the debt balance be spread over a longer period as this would reduce the rate a little.

Mr. A. Deasy, referring to the Health Service grants which they get from the Department at present, said that a grant of 56.7% of the total expenditure was surely too small. He said that as a result of the increase in the wholesale tax, imposed by Government, prices had gone sky high. He pointed out that the Government would take in several million more pounds as a result of this, but they should be prepared to give it out in the form of increased grants.

Mr. F. J. O'Leary, County Councillor, said that the Health rate in the county was 29 1/2 in the £ and in the coming year this would be increased to 32 1/2 with an additional 8d. for Public Assistance. This would mean an increase of approximately 3 1/2 in the £. In reply to questions concerning the rate, Mr. O'Leary said that a Commission was at present dealing with all aspects of the rate. He said that services and developments could be expected in a year or so.

Mr. A. O'Connell, County Manager, said that the County members on the Health Authority had strongly advocated spreading the repayment of the debt balance but it had been agreed by majority vote to follow the same procedure as last year. Since the estimate had been provisionally adopted, he had been unofficially informed that the Voluntary Hospitals were going to increase their charges by 10 or 20 per cent and no provision had been made in the estimate to meet such increases.

NOT TRUE

They had agreed after negotiations on the figures to be paid by South Tipperary to Ardkeen for treatment and had also a working agreement in regard to

GORK HOSPITALS
 Mr. M. Hartly said that he had previously proposed a resolution which had been approved by the Health Authority that the District Hospital in Dungarvan be retained in its present status and that it be increased to 80 beds.

It was an injustice, he said, that patients from Dungarvan and West Waterford should at present be sent to hospitals in Cork instead of to Ardkeen.

The Manager said that this was not correct. He had decided to go to Cork hospitals where they would pay the approved rates for them there. There was no question of sending patients from Dungarvan to Cork instead of to Ardkeen.

Mr. Curran said that their final consideration should be that to state Health Authority facilities at Dungarvan were not adequate or comparable with the services available at Ardkeen.

On the proposal of Mr. Quirk seconded by A. Faherty, D., the Council then unanimously agreed to refer back the estimate to the Health Authority with a recommendation that in order to alleviate the impact on the rate, the liquidation of the debt balance be spread over a longer period.
