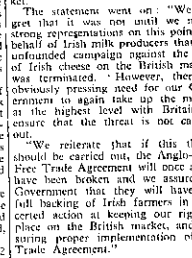

Offenders will be liable to prosecution. It is illegal to dehorn cattle over two weeks old without using an anaesthetic.

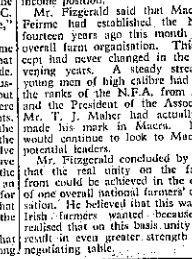

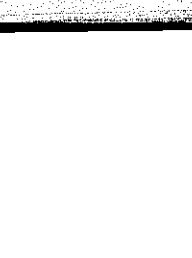
