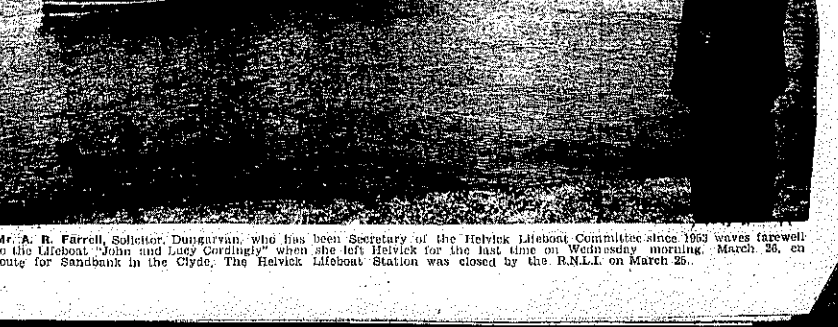

Waterford Out in First Round
Clare Win U21 Football Game

Waterford's Under-21 foot- ballers had a fruitless journey to Kilrush on Sunday last where they were kicked out of the Munster championship by Clare. The home-side's winning tally of 4-6 to 1-5 tells the dismal story of a poor Waterford effort in this first round encounter. Clare dominated almost entirely and with Waterford well beaten at centre- half went into a 3-5 to 0-1 interval lead.

Waterford's only purple patch in a game in which they were otherwise outclassed and out- manœuvred, came at the start of the second half when some posi- tional changes brought a momen- tary improvement to the side. They scored 1-2 in the first five minutes but once again Clare came back into the picture, regain- ing control and eventually ran out easy winners.

KILROSSANTY BEST IN FREE-RIDDEN SEMI-FINAL

Two Sent Off In "Dirty" Game
Kilrossanty 2-6 Geraldines 0-1

Kilrossanty were through to the final of the 1968 Pheelin Cup Competition. But there was little glory for them or their opponents in their semi-final victory over Aglish Geraldines at Dungarvan on Sunday last for this semi-final which the Comraigh men easily won by 2-6 to 0-1, produced one of the roughest and "dirtiest" hours of football seen at the Fraher field in many a long day.

FREE RIDDEN

From the start the game was free-riden with fists, boos and elbows being used indiscriminately by players from both sides and at the half-way stage when Kilrossanty led 2-6 to 0-1, it was evident that unless referee V. Mulligan (Dungarvan) took ac- tion, then a serious clash was in- evitable.

The breaking point came two minutes after the restart when Ned Merrin (Geraldines) was sent to the line for questioning a decision given by the referee against him. This was an excep- tionally harsh decision considering the conduct of several other play- ers in the preceding half. Then a minute later Mickey Tobin also of Geraldines was quite rightly sent to the line for striking an op- ponent, but the referee got his chance later to really assert control over the game when Kilrossanty's full-back, Mattie Loneragan, blatantly struck an Aglish player while he was on the ground. This incident called for severe discip- linary action but the referee failed to impose the proper sentence and things really got out of hand after that and the referee was forced to call both sides together in the 13th minute to issue a warning to the crowd with the threat of abandon- ment if players failed to control themselves.

The situation improved consid- erably after this but there was bad feelings on all sides when the game ended. The full time score paints a true picture of the game. Kilross- anty were "blessed" in the third minute when a long clearance from Noel Walsh was punched to the Geraldines net following a mis- take in the goal area. Five minutes later Tom Rioridan broke through for another Comraigh goal and from then on the winners were never in danger.

Tom Walsh and "Mitters" Casey (free) added points to which Geraldines replied with their only score of the game, a point from a free per John Cotter in the 28th minute. "Mitters" Casey pointed a Kil- rossanty free in the fourth min- ute of the second half but Gera- ldines, minus two, showed consid- erable improvement and had the better of the exchange for the following fifteen of so minutes but poor finishing by a weak attack defeated their best efforts.

Lismore qualified for the Win- ter League Hurling semi-final at the Fraher field, Dungarvan, on Sunday last, where before a handful of spectators they re- gularly defeated Stradbally in a game which failed to produce a high standard of hurling, much in the way of entertainment.
