THIRTY YEARS AGO From the file of the "Dungarvan Leader" dated May 13, 1939, I take the following references to happenings of thirty years ago.

"Confirmation At Abbeyside—At Abbeyside Parish Church on Tuesday morning last May 9, his Lordship, Most Rev. Dr. Jeremiah Kinane, Bishop of Waterford and Lismore, administered the Sacrament of Confirmation to the boys and girls of Abbeyside, Garranbane, Ballinroad and Ballinacoury Schools. Mass was celebrated at 10.30 by Rev. M. Power, C.C., and his Lordship who presided was attended by Very Rev. N. Danyphy, P.P., Abbeyside and Very Rev. P. F. McGrath, P.P., Ring and Old Parish."

"The Budget—Income tax was increased by 1/- to 5/6; tobacco duty was raised by 8d. per lb. and the duty on petrol by 2d. per gallon in Mr. Sean Macchinn's shortest Budget for some years, introduced in the Dail on Wednesday last."

"New Potatoes—The first this season were seen in Dungarvan last week-end and samples were on sale at 3d. per lb. On inquiry we learned that they came from Ballinacoury, a district widely noted for its early crop of new potatoes."

"The Weather—Truly regal weather conditions are prevailing as we go to press this week. Real May sunshine in which most people are reveling after the dreary winter."

SAYING IT WITH THEIR POCKETS

AGRICULTURAL COMMITTEE MEMBERS REFUSE TO ACCEPT INCREASED MILEAGE ALLOWANCE

We have been preaching economy here and in the County Council and we should practice it ourselves said Mr. N. Walsh at the monthly meeting of the County Agricultural Committee of Agriculture held in Dungarvan last Monday during a discussion on a suggestion that the travelling allowances paid to members should be increased from 1/4 to 1/6 per mile.

Mr. G. T. Frost, C.A.O., said that the Department was prepared to approve of the increase from the existing rate of 1/- per mile to 1/6 per mile while subsistence allowances could also be increased from 15/- to 25/- and from 25/- to 30/- according to the length of time members were absent from their homes attending meetings.

Mr. J. Fahey, T.D., Chairman, said that the new allowances were the same as those now in operation by the County Council.

Mr. K. O'Ryan said that when these increases came before the County Council for approval he voted against them and he was going to do so now again.

Mr. N. Walsh said that he intended to adopt the same attitude and did not want to take the increase. He asked whether it was obligatory on members to accept the increases once they had been approved by the Department.

Mr. Fahey replied that it was not obligatory. "It is a matter for each member," he continued "to decide whether he will take it or not but I think where members can do without the increase they should not take it."

In another county I was surprised to find that there were quite a number of members who do not claim.

Mr. Walsh—Well I only want the old rate. We have been preaching economy here and in the County Council and we should practice it ourselves.

Mr. Fahey again pointed out that it was not mandatory on any member to accept the increases but he said that if any member wanted to claim them then the Committee would have to pass a resolution to approve of them.

Mr. Walsh—I admire the members here for the economy they are practicing in this matter. Mr. O'Ryan—It's an awful pity that T.D.'s and Senators didn't do the same thing when
