KILROSSANTY TO BEAT MITCHELS

GERALDINES UNDERDOGS FOR GAME v. TRAMORE. By Commentator. NEXT SUNDAY. Three weeks of football games are down for decision on Sunday next and if we are to base our opinions on the form of the competing sides then we can reasonably expect that one of the six teams playing on Sunday, will be county champions in October.

All games listed are in my opinion, wide open and despite what some football enthusiasts may think, I believe that this also applies to the Kill versus Strabally game which goes on at Walsh Park in the afternoon. Strabally apart from their failure against Tramore in the semi-final last year, have been showing wonderful improvement in football over the past two years and many observers in the West believe that they have never been better than they are just now.

They have won the Western section of the Phelan Cup Competition, being undefeated up to now, and have won their training with a good win in this competition against Bree Rangers on Tuesday night. I believe that they are good enough to beat Kill, who are the current champions.

AT DUNGARVAN. The meeting of the new formed county Kilrossanty and the Mitchels at the Frater field on Sunday evening is almost certain to be the biggest crowd puller in the preliminary rounds and very few football fans will miss this attractive clash. With these sides in opposition, there is more than a place in the second round of a stake race for many of the players involved, the prestige value of victory will amount to more than a win in what is only a qualifying round. The losers will have a second bite at the apple by way of the losers group.

Three weeks ago we saw Kilrossanty play county champions Kill twice in the 1968 Phelan Cup final and taking them to be as good now as they were then, one could go for a Kilrossanty win. The latest reports about the Mitchels is that they are also in top form following two wins in the Phelan Cup and this is what makes it difficult for one to make a forecast of the result.

I predict a Kilrossanty win and I do so on the grounds that their top players, Pe and Noel Walsh, Jordan, Casey, Cunningham, Ormond, etc., etc., are in the top of their form. It is likely to play even better than they did against Bree. It is a tough game though and anything can happen.

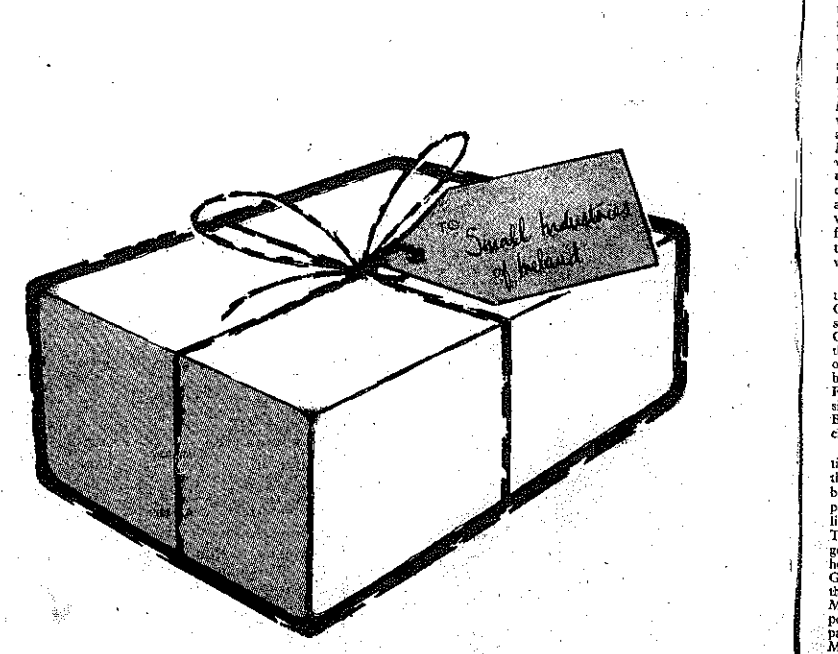
