WATTS WEEKS BRAG?—A RECORD

Stradbally Favourites For Under 21 Football Final

FULL LIST OF CHAMPIONSHIP GAMES FOR SUNDAY

NEXT SUNDAY'S GAMES. A full list of championship games, which include some very interesting clashes between the sides now attempting to reach the final, is held on far supporters at Dungarvan and Lismore on Sunday next, while football supporters in the Aghalane area will be wishing to see their side, Geraldines, home in their game against Gaultier in the second round of the senior football championships.

At a three-year programme at the Frater field, Aghalane, a mixed grade championship clash, with the under 21 football final between Stradbally and Ballynemeela scheduled to open the programme. This will be followed by the Trickey versus Clashmore senior hurling clash, and at 7 p.m. we have the local derby between Valley Rovers and their neighbours the Nire, in their quarter final meeting in the intermediate football championships.

Stradbally, now riding the crest of the wave in four of our championship events, will be a very serious preparation for the game, will be favoured to take their title in this grade. Their displays against Ardmore, Aghalane, and Tourin in the county quarter final, to be named as the favourites, but the tremendous experience gained by the team who helped their senior side to their present position in the competition, may be the factor which will mean most to them in the Aghalane, Power, Murray, Curran, Patsy, Murray, Colley and Casey. Stradbally have a bunch of top class footballers, but not nearly so outplayed.

Ballynemeela began the season with a major shock when they defeated the county champions, Tallow, on a muddy pitch at Easter. The team, led by Na Píraigh in the semi-final. If they reproduce their form of last year I would feel confident in giving them the vote.

The evening game (intermediate football) here is being regarded as one of the most attractive games in this championship and all meetings between the Valley and their neighbours the Nire and produced excellent standards of splendid football, public expectations might again be justified. 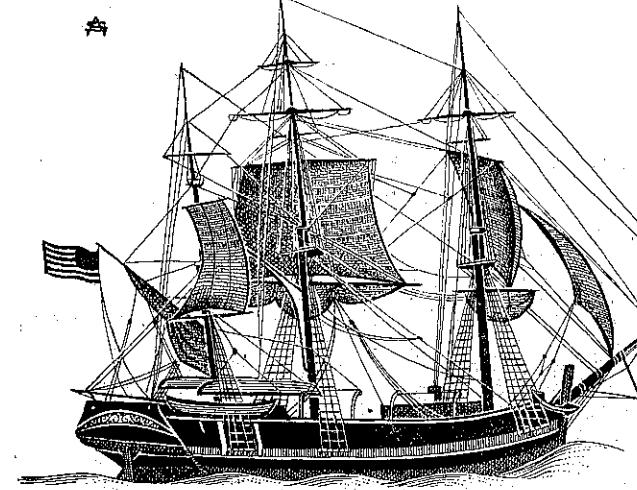
