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THE PLIGHT OF NORTHERN
CATHOLICS
CHARITY WALK NEXT
SUNDAY
Weather permitting, the Dun-
garvan Junior Chamber of Com-
merce have organised a Charity
Walk for next Sunday. The pro-
ject has already been well ad-
vanced and it is hoped that sev-
eral hundred walkers, each backed
by as many sponsors as possible will
participate.
The route will take the walkers
over one of the most scenic courses
in the neighbourhood of Dun-
garvan on a circuit of about 19 miles.
Starting at the Tourist Caravan
on the Square the walkers will head
for Two-mile-bridge and then on to
Knockragh Cross, Halfway Cross,
Pulla, Pulla Cross, Byrne's Cross,
Ring College Cross, Leagh Cross
and back to Killmogh Cross and
back to the Tourist Caravan again.
At each of the points mentioned
there will be a check-point where
walkers will be issued with a card
to record their progress.
The Junior Chamber Committee
in charge of the project have ar-
ranged for the provision of milk
and soft drinks for the walkers at
three of the points: Knockragh,
Byrne's Cross and Leagh Cross, but
each walker should bring at least
a small snack to bridge any pos-
sible gap that might be inclined
to hinder the inner man on the way.
The start of the walk will take
place between 10 a.m. and 11.30
a.m. and walkers can choose the
time best suited to themselves to
start. All they are required to do,
outside of getting as many sponsors
as possible, is to check in at the
check-points where the walk are

Sectarian Aggression In Six-Counties Deplored

CO. COUNCIL PLAN TO HELP DISTRESSED FAMILIES

The Protestant Community in the South were horrified and ashamed, and deplored and condemned the sectarian aggression in the Six Counties, Mr. H. R. Dowd, a Church of Ireland member of Waterford County Council stated at the specially convened meeting of the Council in Dungarvan on Friday last. The meeting was called to discuss plans to help the victims of the recent happenings in the Six Counties.

At the outset the Chairman, Mr. G. Curran said that since their last meeting a very serious situation had developed in the North where 450 years of persecution their own kin and had now been attacked, gassed and even murdered, simply because they had sought their basic rights. In their hour of need and agony they in the 26 Counties were all the people in the North had to turn to for help and they could not desert them. There was an obligation on them to help these people and to try to find a solution to the whole problem.

Mr. Curran went on to say that the happenings in the North had proved conclusively that very little separated Fianna Fail, Fine Gael or Labour, for they all had a deep love of their country. The sectarian bitterness in the North had been propagated over the years to keep the Catholic minority in subjection and now it had led to murder.

Mr. Curran added that he decided to call this special meeting because local Authorities all over the country had taken similar action.

Mr. W. Kennedy, T.D., said it was deeds and not words that were now needed. It should be their aim to help in every way possible those people who had lost their homes and belongings. Waterford Corporation had already held a public meeting to form an aid society and if the County Council could co-operate with the Corporation it would be an excellent idea. In Waterford City they were channeling everything received through the Red Cross and the Knights of Malta, and it would be a good thing to see the county and city united on this project.

EXPLOSIVE SITUATION
Mr. N. Walsh, leader of the F.G. Party on the Council said this was the most important specially convened meeting ever held by Waterford County Council. They were dealing with a highly delicate and explosive situation in the North, and here in the Republic irrespective of politics, class or creed they were all of the one mind in this matter. As the premier public body in the county it was only right that they reiterate what the Government had already stated when they announced not for the first time that they laid claim to the sovereignty of a 32 county Ireland. From that claim they would not budge an inch and it was their deepest sorrow that British
