DUNGARVAN CHARITY WALK
To the 102 walkers who took part in last Sunday's Charity Walk organized by the Junior Chamber of Commerce in Dungarvan I say well done; to the 500 who might have taken part but who did not say shame on you.
Well done those who walked for besides taking up the challenge of the nineteen odd miles walk, they were helping to raise funds for a number of most worthy charities in the town; for shame the rest because they allowed such a splendid opportunity pass them by.
Having said this let us go on to other aspects of the Charity Walk. The weather was ideal and a very high number, 80 per cent of the starters, managed to complete the course. Included amongst the walkers were eleven Nuns of the Mercy Order, seven of whom went all the way; a blind telephonist employed by Waterford County Council; children from nine to twelve years of age; teenagers at both ends of that age group; young men and women and at least one veteran. For practically all, the toughest part of the walk was the long haul going up Strive's Hill. Two mile-bridge although a few told me that they found the fall of ground after passing through Fula Cross almost as tough.
A visitor to the town who took part was Mr. Peter O'Malley, Secretary of the Lincoln Junior Chamber of Commerce.
First along the 19.1 mile route were two Junior Chamber members, James Ducey and Billy Fitzgerald, and both checked in at the eight check points along the way well on schedule and were the first to finish having kept up a steady 4 miles an hour pace all the way. Several others of the walkers also succeeded in keeping up this excellent pace while more took their time and aimed more on finishing than on speed.
Congratulations to the Junior Chamber members for the excellent organization of the event, the walk they overlooked nothing and even provided liquid refreshments at a number of the check points to quench the thirst of the walkers. It was reasonable then, having gone to such great lengths to organize the event, that a spokesman for the Junior Chamber should express regret and disappointment at the comparatively small numbers that took part.
However, the civic minded members of the community, young and old, who did turn out will have the satisfaction of knowing that their combined efforts will benefit the poor, the old and the handicapped and this satisfaction will mean more to them than anything I could say here.

HOME FROM LONDON

RESULTS OF 1969 TIDY TOWNS COMPETITION

LITTER STILL A SERIOUS PROBLEM

Third time lucky—that's the story of Tyrrellspass, Co. Westmeath, who have won the top award in Bord Fáilte's National Tidy Towns Competition. The village (population 360) was first entered in the 1967 competition and has since then been a regular contender. Last year it was awarded the prize for the best centre in the Midland Tourism Region.
Tyrrellspass received 138 out of a possible 180 marks this year, four more than 1968. Its nearest rival for the title of Ireland's Tidiest Town was Malin, Co. Donegal, with 135 marks.
Prizes this year totalled 557, the highest since the competition began 12 years ago. Three judges were impressed by the town's success in its efforts to improve its environment without losing its essential character. The village is an example for other towns.
The category awards went to Malin, Tyrrellspass, Ballycotton, Casanovans Mor, Monaghan, Ballyvaughan, and Carrick-on-Suir.
In addition, there were prizes for the best centre in each county region: best seaside resort; the best village on a navigable waterway; the best new centre; the best most commendable effort. Five additional prizes were donated by commercial firms.
Commenting on Tyrrellspass, the judges said the village "captured the imagination of the competition—tidiness without fussiness, simplicity, rather than over-elaboration."
The efforts of the community have brought about improvements without detracting from the essential character of the village. If any centre wishes a model for their own endeavours in the future, we can do no better than recommend them to have a look at the achievements in Tyrrellspass, they are well deserved.
HAVE POTENTIAL TO WIN MAJOR AWARDS
In a general comment, the judges said it was heartening to note the increasing number of centres with the potential to win a major prize in the competition. Many of the centres can be regarded as serious contenders—and as many more could be added to that number if present efforts by the community are maintained.
In many centres, the problem is again a serious one—people and local authorities alike were urged to take more positive steps to improve their centres and introduce litter-consciousness at the earliest opportunity.
