Affane Awarded Abandoned Senior Football Game

CLUBS TO FORFEIT GATE ALLOWANCES

At a special meeting of the Waterford County Board G.A.A. held at the Courthouse, Dungarvan, on Monday night last, to consider the referee's report on the abandoned Affane/Brickey Rangers senior football championship replay, played in Dungarvan on Sunday, September 21st, Affane, who were leading 1-10 to nil at the time of abandonment, were awarded the game. Both clubs will forfeit the gate allowances due from the game and Jack Cooney of Brickets, who was reported by the referee to have been sent off for striking an opponent was suspended for two months.

The meeting which lasted approximately ninety minutes was presided over by County Board Chairman Mr. P. Fanning. Mr. S. O'Brien, Secretary of the Western Board proposed the two month suspension on Cooney and this was seconded by T. Donnelly, Eire Oge.

CENTRE OF ATTRACTION

The referee, Sergt. V. Mulligan, in his report said that when the game started in the second half he ordered Jack Cooney to the line for striking an opposing player with his fist. When he attempted to resume play a general melee had developed in which two who were not players and with Affane connections became involved. One of these in particular, the referee's report stated seemed to be the "centre of attraction" because of the tensions and feelings on both sides he terminated the game. He had, the report stated, been informed by the Brickey Club that the two men involved were the Chairman and Secretary of the Affane club.

Mr. McGraw then stated that he was an official of the Affane Club at the game. He thought the referee's report was pretty accurate. The Affane officials he said were on the field trying to get the Affane players away from the melee. He himself was on the field for the same intention but they weren't successful. He said he was a very difficult situation. They were trying to get away but were followed by the Brickey players. Paddy McGrath, captain of the Affane team, said he was not involved in the melee. However, he said, anyone could see that any team leading by 1-10 to nil would not start a row.

TROUBLE FROM THE SIDE LINE

Nicholas McGrath, Chairman of the Brickey Club, who acted as spokesman for them stated that he was faced towards their own goal about forty yards away. He looked out and saw one of their players being put to the line. A number of players had convened at the spot and he could not see clearly. It was, however, obvious that the trouble came from the side-line and not the field. He next saw the referee walking off and the fighting continuing.

ATTACKED

The cause of the trouble as they saw it was that Paddy Donnelly (Brickets) went into the row separating players who were involved. Donnelly was then attacked from the side-line and the person who attacked him had been named as Paddy McCarthy (Affane). Munster Council Representative Tom Cunningham said the only thing that struck him was why the game could not be finished. Both teams gave the impression that they were anxious to finish it and he thought the game could have, and should have been finished.

BISHOP'S PRAISE FOR JUNIOR CHAMBER PROJECT

NEW CHILDREN'S PLAYGROUND IN DUNGARVAN BLESSED

In brilliant sunshine the ceremony of blessing the new children's playground at Quinn's, Dungarvan, was performed by Most Rev. Dr. Russell, Bishop of Waterford and Lismore on Thursday evening last week. The simple but impressive ceremony was attended by members of the Dungarvan Junior Chamber of Commerce who planned and financed the establishment of the playground, members and officials of Dungarvan Urban Council, Ven. Archbishop Power, P.P., V.F. and members of the clergy of the parish and hundreds of young children and many of their parents.

Prior to the blessing of the playground, it was formally handed over on behalf of the Junior Chamber by Mr. A. Hallahan, successful candidate, who had created all the equipment free of charge and the thanked the Urban Council for having made the site available. Mr. P. Harnett, Chairman of the Junior Chamber sub-committee who were responsible for financing the project to such a successful conclusion presided at the function.

In a short address, Mr. Hallahan on behalf of the Junior Chamber welcomed all to the official opening and blessing of the playground. He recalled that last November the Junior Chamber Chapter in Dungarvan formed a sub-committee under Mr. Harnett to investigate the possibility of establishing a playground for the children. Many hours of hard work were put into the project by the members of the committee in charge, and said Mr. Hallahan, "the proof of the effort and organisation that went into it can be seen around you here now."

Mr. Hallahan went on to say that apart from the very heavy financial burden on the Urban Council, the project had cost the Urban Council nothing and had been financed entirely by the Junior Chamber. "This," said Mr. Harnett, "is a wonderful effort of citizenship in Dungarvan by the members of our Junior Chamber who have done so many other fine things already and who, I hope, will continue to do others in the future."

The attendance of Most Rev. Dr. Russell at the function said Mr. Harnett stressed the importance of the occasion and he appealed to adults and teenagers to see to it that the equipment in the playground was left for the smaller children for whom it was intended.

BISHOP'S ADDRESS

Dr. Russell then blessed the playground and afterwards he said that the playground now belonged to the people and children of the town and was something which had been done outside of the Urban Council. Dr. Russell went on to say that the usual attitude was to expect Councils and Corporations to do this and that, but here they had something which was done by the people of the town. He praised the members of the Dungarvan Junior Chamber for their wonderful effort and also the Urban Council for co-operating so generously with it by providing a site.

Addressing the huge number of children present, his Lordship said that he wished them every enjoyment in their new playground and he asked them to be good to each other, to respect each other and to learn to live with each other as the words of the song put it in your own hometown, Dungarvan.

Mr. P. Harnett then thanked his Lordship for coming to bless the project, the Urban Council for providing the site and all others who had helped them to bring the project to a successful conclusion. Subsequently his Lordship moved through the crowds of children and examined several of the pieces of equipment in the playground.

Mr. Harnett said that he was in no way responsible for stopping the game. They accepted to the fact that they were losing by 13 points but said that there was no proof given that they were responsible for stopping the game and there was no proof offered that any of their players were involved. They made an effort to have the game continued and they would have a grievance if strictures of any kind was imposed on them.

N. Dalton (De La Salle) said that it was serious that two teams going out on the field could not finish the match. The Board he said must take a very serious view of it.

Finally the Chairman said he felt some punishment should be meted out to the teams because of the contradictory nature of the evidence prevented a definite decision to impose a penalty on the individuals responsible for the melee. He again stated that the gate allowances payable to both clubs from the game be withheld and in conclusion expressed the hope that the meeting would be the last of its kind this year.

THE PROBLEMS OF COMMUNITY CARE IN RURAL AREAS

The current issue of "Bulletin" the magazine issued by the Mental Health Association of Ireland, contains the following article by Mrs. Rebecca McRynal, Community Health Worker, Waterford Health Authority on "The Problems of Community Care in Rural Areas".

Out-patient clinics are usually arranged in towns with a hinterland of up to four dispensary areas. Towns with a population of 2,000 up to 4,000 persons particularly fall into this category. For medical purposes I would prefer to regard small towns and rural areas as being of a similar nature—with a few exceptions.

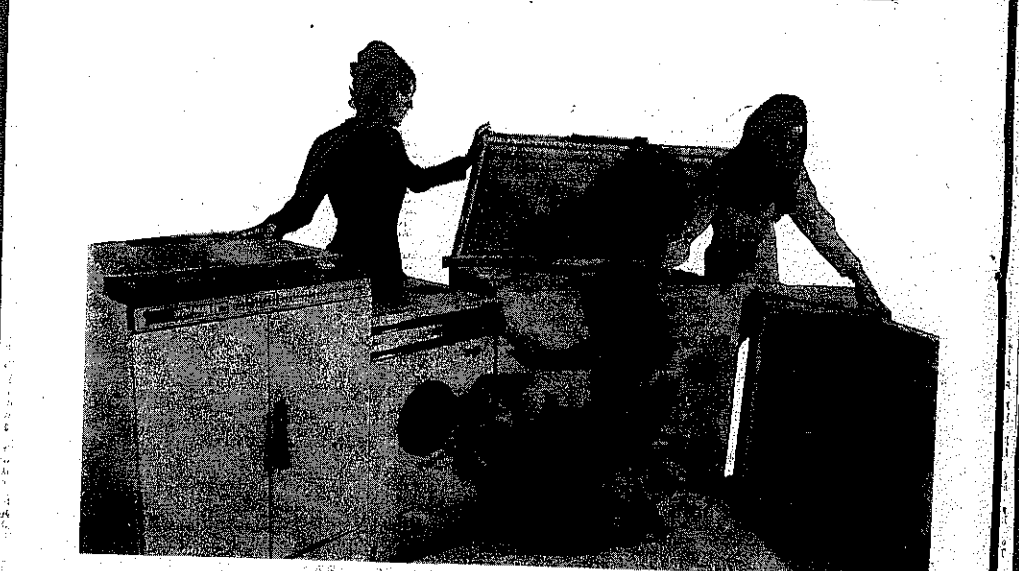
