More about decimals

Knowing that 5 means a half, how do we find the decimal for a quarter and for three quarters? A quarter is, of course, half of a half, Divide, 5 by 2 and we find it. The answer is .25. Remember the point and the fact that you can add ciphers after any decimal. For instance, 5 or 107-can be written as.50 as it will be in our mow money system — meaning fifty pence.
