Quigley Magnesite To Sponsor Dungarvan International Sea Angling Competition

BIG PLANS FOR MINI-OLYMPIC 3-DAY GOLD MEDAL CONTESTS

At a reception arranged jointly by the Dungarvan Sea Angling Club and Dungarvan Harour Sailing Club held at the Hotel Ormonde last Friday plans for the coming season were announced by both Clubs.

The prime announcement of the evening was that of Mr. Nick Cleary, Chairman of the Angling Club when he stated that this year's Mini Olympic 3 Day Gold Medal International Deep Sea Angling Competition from September 18-20 would be sponsored totally by the Quigley-Magnesite Division of Pfizer Chemical Corporation Ltd.

The club originally formed in 1956 by a group of local angling enthusiasts has prospered in "rags to riches" fashion.

"In 1956 small local offshore fishing competitions were held. "Nor until the first Deep Sea Angling Competition was run in 1958 off Helvick did the potential of the "deep blue" become known.

"The past Dungarvan Sea Angling Club has become well known for its organisation of competitions and the hospitality that goes with them.

"The Nimrod Club, London, under the leadership of Fred Crisp have shown to tourists what a fishing paradise is Dungarvan.

"The Shannon Airport Angling Club under the guidance of the late Con McMahon have also realised its potential by holding its annual competitions here since 1968 and by in fact holding its 21st Competition in Dungarvan in July, 1970.

"The mini-style olympic competition, the brainchild of present club secretary, Michael Moloney, is this year 1970, being held on 18th/20th September, 1970.

"While in 1969 medals were won by anglers from England, Germany, Belgium, Holland, Switzerland, Dublin, Shannon, Aer Lingus, Kilkenny, Cork and Dungarvan it is hoped that this year a greater international participation will take place.

INCREASES APPROVED FOR CO. COUNCIL ROAD WORKERS AND DRIVERS

Waterford County Council at their meeting in Dungarvan last Monday unanimously approved revised rates of pay for road workers and drivers employed by the Council.

Mr. T. Cunningham, Staff Officer, said the scales had been negotiated between the employees' Union and the County Manager. Agreement was reached whereby the road workers and related grades would receive an increase of 35/- a week from April 1st last to March 31st 1971, and drivers would get an increase of £2 a week from April 1st last to December 31st this year.

Mr. Cunningham said the new scales would now give the road workers a weekly wage of £14-10-0. Provision had been made in this year's estimate for an increase of 30/- and a total of £2,850 would now have to be met out of rates.

On the proposal of Mr. P. Cahill, seconded by Mr. M. J. Shalloo the revised rates were unanimously approved.
