Early in January, 1970 plans for the new Christian Brothers School in Lismore were submitted to Planning Authority, Water-ford County Council About the same time Waterford County Council and the same time Waterford County Council passed a grant of 12,500 to bring up rewerage from the town via Gallows Hill and Tallow Road in order to connect with the sewerage from the new school. According to the plans, the new school was to face Tallow Road and the sewerage was to be directed into the existing sewer towards New Street. Accordingly the Planning Authority stated that an expenditure of £2,500 was unnecessary. At the same time they stated that they would not allow the school to face Tallow Road as being dangerous and directed the Board of Works to change the plans so that the school would face Ballyauchor Road. The Board of Works made a second plan but in this one the sewerage would have to be routed on to Tallow Road. Planning Authority it seems are not satisfied with the second plan and are directing the Board of Works to make a third plan so that sowerage can be directed to New Street. This action of the Planning Authority is arbitrary and is holding up a project that has already experienced considerable delay.
