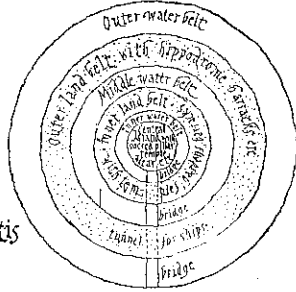

MEETING WITH DEPARTMENT ON VETERINARY MATTERS

A delegation representing N.F.A. Livestock Committee, Liquid Milk Group and the Dairy Committee will meet officials of the Department of Agriculture on Tuesday, 7th July, 1970, for discussions on a number of matters relating to Animal Health.

On brucellosis eradication, one of the main items for discussion will be the question of ensuring that the selection of areas for eradication measures will be so arranged as to minimise any disturbance of the established pattern of livestock movement as between one country and another.
