Urban Council To Hold Special Meeting To Discuss Quay Problem

NO GREAT HOPES OF GOVERNMENT GRANT

He would hate to put the members of the deputation astray by saying otherwise but he personally could not see any repairs being carried out to the damaged quay wall within the next six weeks, said Mr. T. Kyne, Chairman, at last week's meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council at which a joint deputation from the Abbeyside Labour Party and the Dungarvan Branch A.T. & G.A.U. attended.

Mr. Kyne at the outset said that the deputation came to discuss the matter of the quay wall. They were all aware that the present quay was 150 years old and it was now in a deplorable condition. He went on to say that the members of the Council were as anxious as anyone to put the quay in a safe condition for boats to come in. They had endeavoured to get Government loans to finance the outlay involved and had agreed to put up a big capital sum from the Council's finances. They had even got the three T.D.'s for the constituency to come to a meeting and they had promised to take the matter up with the appropriate Departments.

"Since then," said Mr. Kyne, "we have heard nothing official and it looks to me unlikely that we will hear anything now for a considerable time." Mr. Kyne then said that two boats were due to come in shortly but if they were unable to renew their insurance on the quay then they would have to tell the shippers that they were coming in at their own risk. The position was, he said, that they had been unable to obtain insurance cover up to last week. If the deputation had any suggestions to make about solving the problem he would be grateful to hear them.

TRAFFIC PROBLEMS IN DUNGARVAN GETTING STEADILY WORSE

One Way Streets Only Suggested

The situation was getting steadily worse and parking was becoming more difficult, said Mr. Austin Deasy at last week's meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council when a discussion took place on traffic management proposals for the town.

In the course of a report on the matter the Town Clerk, Mr. J. P. Robinson, stated that the County Engineer's report on the subject was submitted and discussed by the Council at a meeting held in January, 1970. Following consideration of the matter, the Council agreed to recommend to the County Council that an off-street car-park should be provided at Scanlon's Yard as soon as possible. Consideration of other matters in the report were deferred pending investigation of the parking problem, which was considered to be the major item.

ATTRACTIVE RATES

Mr. Whelan said that the Council should provide whatever money was needed as something would have to be done. He understood that the Young Urban Council had offered very attractive rates to the Co-Op. in Dungarvan to insure through Young Urban Council. This happened it would mean more money going out of the town.

ESSENTIAL

Mr. J. Organ, Chairman, Abbeyside Labour Party, expressed the view that the work could be done much cheaper. It was essential he said that the Council should do something about the matter soon or else the whole quay would be gone. "If we lose the shipping this year," he added, "we will never get it back again."
