Impressive Ceremony in Friary Church

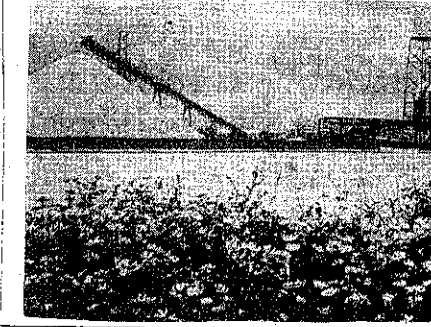

New £64,000 Vocational School Officially Opened

THIRTY-THREE YEARS SINCE IDEA WAS FIRST MOOTED

After a wait of thirty-three years since the idea was first mooted the new Vocational School at Kilmacothomas, built at a cost of £64,000, was officially opened on Monday last by Mr. Michael Keenan, T.D., Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Education. The school was jointly blessed by His Lordship Most Rev. Dr. Michael Russell, Bishop of Waterford and Lismore and the Church of Ireland for the diocese of Waterford, Lismore, Cashel and Emly Rt. Rev. John Ward-Armstrong.
In his address to the large gathering, Mr. Keenan said that a pupil enrolling in the vocational school now had the opportunity of being able to progress as far in the educational field as his or her aptitudes and talents permitted.
"Equality of opportunity in one of the main objectives of our educational policy and it is heartening to see how much progress has been made in the realisation of this desirable aim."
The new regional technical college in Waterford, said Mr. Keenan, was likely to attract many students from vocational as well as other post-primary schools in the area. These colleges would, among other things, provide higher education courses in a range of disciplines.
"The need for technicians is being daily emphasised and is likely to grow more acute as our economy develops," the Parliamentary Secretary said.

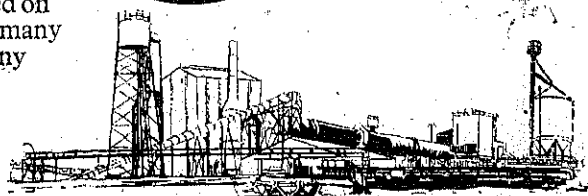

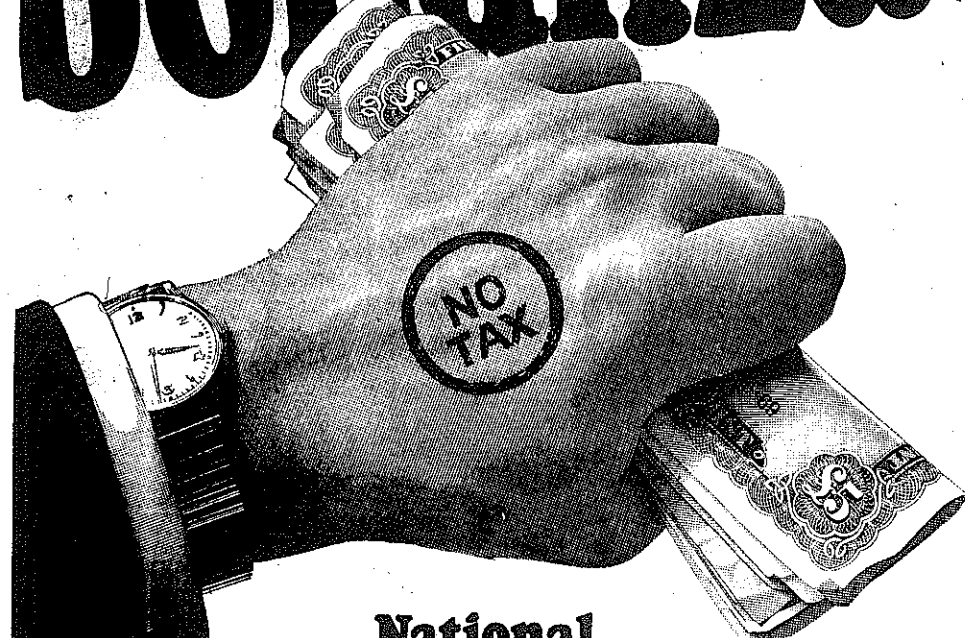

KILL BREEZE THROUGH TO S.F. FINAL
Affane Way Out Of Their Class

Kill 1-18; Affane 0-9.

Unless one was aware of the power Kill could unleash then one could not possibly visualise them as potential champions while looking at them make "mince meat" of Affane in their senior football semi-final clash at the Frasher Field, Dungarvan, on Sunday last. Yet even at half steam the favourites breezed through to the final against opposition way out of their class.

The fact that Kill finished the game with twelve points to spare, after an indifferent display, only serves to highlight the great disparity between the standards of both sides, and emphasises the alarmingly poor quality of most of the teams, with the exception of a few, in the county today.

DIED

Kill improved after a very poor start to toy with the opposition in a game which had withered and died as a contest long before the finish.

Only once in the game were they headed. This was early in the first half when Pat Denn pointed a free for Affane after sixty seconds. Playing against the strong breeze the winners looked anything but impressive and shot three wides from close in frees before Seamus Keavans brought them to terms

BEYOND REDEMPTION
