THE FESTIVE SPIRIT

With Christmas now only a few weeks away the festive spirit is at last making itself felt. Our streets are lighted by a multitude of coloured bulbs and the windows of the shops are full of most attractive displays and all are leading themselves to a time of good cheer.

SLAUGHTER ON THE ROADS

While the season of goodwill is now with us there seems to be no end to the slaughter on our roads. Figures for the first eleven months of this year show that 475 people were killed, 63 more than last year. For the month of November alone the number of people who lost their lives in traffic accidents was 52! And the cause of the majority of the accidents has not been bad roads but bad driving.

Making great, wide roads does not appear to be the answer to the mounting fatalities as the record shows that many of the more serious accidents occur on straight, wide stretches of these roads. On Monday last one of England's great arterial highways, the M5 four people died in a 30 vehicle pile-up and 12 were seriously injured. On the same day on the M5 there was another series of crashes involving about 100 vehicles. Granted there were heavy fog conditions, still if ordinary precautions were taken these accidents should not have occurred.

A heavy driver who escaped from one of these pile ups said: "Despite the conditions, people were driving like bats out of hell!" A British policeman who was on the scene is reported as having said: "You cannot blame the fog. It is there and people must adjust their driving to it and they have been failing to do this. The main cause of all these crashes is excessive speed."

When multiple crashes of these dimensions occur on the great M5 highways of England I find it hard to reconcile the ideas of our road planners who are aiming to turn some of our principal roads into the same kind of death traps. Wide, straight roads lend themselves to cars being driven at high speeds. These roads cost a great deal of money to construct and maintain. Perhaps a good deal of this money could more constructively be diverted to increasing the strength of Garda road patrols to ensure that motorists observe speed limits at all points. More lives may be saved in this way!

Unmanly, selfish drivers who drive as if their lives depended on getting away from and keeping in front of the other people or who insist on hogging the road or who refuse to give way can contribute much to the unhappiness of many homes during the coming Christmas period. They will be out on the roads over the festive period, full of festive spirit, but with little or no goodwill for their fellow road users. How much nicer it would be for all concerned if these people could now make a good resolution for Christmas to take more care on the roads. It could well make Christmas much happier for many.

A LEAD TO BE FOLLOWED

The decision of the British House of Commons to abolish Standard Time is one that has given almost general satisfaction in England. The amazingly unexpected big majority in favour of the abolition of the scheme when the motion was debated in the British House of Commons earlier this month can leave no doubts as to the attitude of the average Englishman to the unnatural situation which was brought about two years ago when the idea was first introduced.

WINDFALLS FOR CHARITIES

Last Friday night I sat in at a very brief meeting called by Junior Chamber, Dungarvan, to announce the outcome of the Charities Walk organised by them in October. Junior Chamber were represented by their President, Mr. Tom Ryan and Secretary, Mr. John Coleman, who incidentally was also the organiser and chief marshal of the walk.

Present at the meeting also were representatives of five local charities who were to benefit from the fund realised by the walk. It was announced that the total amount collected by walkers from their sponsors, less a small amount to cover outlay (refreshments for walkers, etc.), which was available for division was £610. Of this Mr. Ryan stated that Junior Chamber had decided to make £50 available to the Dungarvan Lourdes Invalid Fund and to divide the balance equally in sums of £140 each to the other four charities.

The cheques were then presented by Mr. Ryan to the representatives of the benefiting Charities and were accepted by Mrs. B. Tyers and Mr. J. J. Moloney on behalf of the Lourdes Invalid Society; Mother Lua and Mrs. W. McGrath representing the Society of Friends of St. Martin; Mr. M. Cusack who received the cheque on behalf of the Dungarvan Conference of St. Vincent de Paul and Mrs. S. Deering and Mr. M. Sexton who represented the Abbesside Conference. Mr. M. C. Nagle accepted the cheque on behalf of St. John's Special School.

Tributes were paid to Junior Chamber and to Mr. Ryan and Mr. Coleman in particular and to the walkers and their sponsors, all of whom had contributed towards making the undertaking such a great success.

One of the speakers referred to the fact that his noted had been taken to groups of collectors who had swept on the town that day collecting for "mentally handicapped children" and for a "Lourdes Invalid Fund." He said that people in the town who had contributed to these collectors had done so on the assumption that it was these local charities which were benefited but this was not so. The question of the bona-fides of such collectors was then raised and it was generally agreed that people, whenever they have doubts as to the genuineness or otherwise of strange collectors should refrain from giving them any support.

Robinson, said the Council owned only a relatively small number of two bedroomed houses and these usually only became vacant when a family was rehoused from one of them into a larger house by the Council. In fact during the present year no two bedroomed house had become vacant.

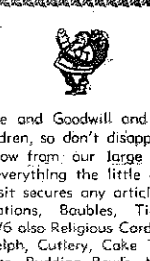
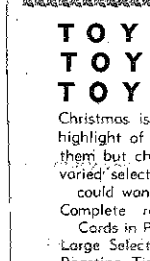
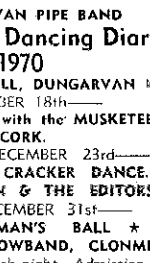
